



Impact Grant Application Form

2009 -10 Impact Award Recipients



Moulsecomb Primary School, Whitehawk Primary School and St Mark's CE Primary School, all located in the East Brighton Trust area, were each awarded an £10,000 Impact Grant in December 2009.

The schools used their Impact Grants to collectively buy 2 minibuses; Moulsecomb Primary School purchased their own mini-bus with match-funding from their Parent's Group and Whitehawk Primary School and St Mark's CE Primary School combined their Impact Grants to purchase a single minibus shared between them.



Impact Grant Application Criteria

The East Brighton Trust Impact Grant is an annual one-off £10,000 grant scheme, whose purpose is to support positive work in the community, address a community issue and provide good long-term benefit to the East Brighton Trust area*. Only 1 Impact grant award is available in the 2010/11 year (1st April to 31st March).

The deadline for all grant applications is 1st November 2010, with decision and notification of award(s) made by 31st January.

To be considered for an Impact Grant applications **MUST** fulfil the **ALL** following criteria:

- The Project must take place in the East Brighton Trust area*.
- The Project must primarily be for the benefit of residents living in the East Brighton Trust area*.
- The Project must be well defined i.e. the date the Project will start and finish; precise goods to be purchased; etc.
- The Project must start within 2 months of receiving notification the grant award.
- The Project may be 'targeted' at a particular community group i.e. as defined by age, gender, ethnicity, but it must, within reason, be open and accessible to all 'target group' residents living in the East Brighton Trust area*.
- Grants are only available to not for profit organisations i.e. charities, voluntary groups / organisations, community-interest companies etc. Statutory organisation may apply, provided the Project does not form part of their core provision.
- Grant funding cannot be used for personal, immoral, illegal, religious worship, or political purposes.
- Provide the last 2 years Trading Accounts.
- Promote the East Brighton Trust in all publicity related to the Project

To distinguish between applications that meet the criteria outlined above, applications will be individually assessed and ranked using the following oversubscription or tie-breaker criteria:

- Applications from organisations that are both 'unique' and based in the East Brighton Trust area* will be viewed more favourably than those organisations that are based outside the area. Likewise groups/organisations based in the city of Brighton and Hove will be viewed more favourably than those based outside the city.
- Applications from organisations that benefit a larger number of residents living within the East Brighton Trust area* will be viewed more favourably than those applications that benefit less residents

Using the oversubscription criteria a short-list of the highest ranked applications will be compiled and invited to present their proposed Project to the East Brighton Trust Board in January 2011. A decision on which organisation receives an Impact Grant award will be made by the Board based on both presentation and submitted application information.

The decision of the East Brighton Trust Board is final
