



## **Middlesex Duo claim Bowls England Bowler of the Year Awards**



**Glen Adams and David Pitt scooped the Junior and Senior Men's Bowler of the Year awards at the Bowls England Men's Annual Dinner and Presentation of Prizes in Coventry on Saturday (22nd February 2020).**

**A shortlist for each award was compiled, with a public vote then taking place to crown the respective winners, with this year seeing the introduction of a Senior award.**

**Glen, from Hendon BC, Middlesex, triumphed in the junior category, sponsored by Bowls International. He enjoyed a successful National Championships, securing the Men's Junior Pairs title with his county compatriot, Alfie Hill, as well as reaching the semi-final of the Junior Singles. Glen made his debut in the England senior International team in June and is also a member of the junior international team.**

**Glen beat off the competition of Harry Goodwin (Devon), Tom McGuinness (Buckinghamshire), Michael Titcombe (Wiltshire) and Scott Winskill (Berkshire).**

Dave secured notable victories over many national champions and international stars of the sport including Andrew Knapper, Graham Ashby, Chris Rodgers and Roger Kendrick to reach the final. Dave also qualified for the National Championships in the Senior Pairs, losing out to eventual winners Dave Labrum and Malc Drage from Buckinghamshire.**

**Also shortlisted in the senior category were Neil Farnish (Buckinghamshire), Mark Hancock (Berkshire), Rob Honeywell (Devon) and John Rednall (Suffolk).**
