

The Royal Marine will soon be on the move... but do not panic! It isn't going far.

It has always seemed odd that the pub fronts directly onto, what is now quite a busy road, Lyne Lane. It would have been so much better if the building was set back from the road with a nice garden frontage. It would boost trade by giving a whole new perspective to the pub, creating a more relaxed setting.

Well that is exactly how it will be in the future! Following a great deal of extensive research we have found that it is feasible to lift the whole building, in one piece, and move it a short distance.

So we are going for it. A contract has been placed with a specialist



company from the USA, Lirpa Loof Inc.

They are professionals in jacking up and moving historic buildings.

Quite obviously the whole scheme is extremely expensive and whilst in the long term trade should increase, the immediate capital expenditure will be raised by sponsorship and media coverage.



Royal Marine Gets Five Star Award

All food catering establishments have to be checked and regulated for good hygiene practice.

Local councils have a team of Environmental Health officers (EHOs) who's job it is to visit food outlets. They can do so without giving notice and can inspect every detail relating to the food handling.

We had such a visit on 15th March 2016. The EHO came in during the afternoon session and proceeded to go through our working practices.

The process is very thorough and covers aspects such as food storage and handling, ensuring fridge and freezer temperatures are correct and proper records are kept.

General cleanliness is important and items such as chopping boards, work surfaces, knives and other cooking implements are checked.

Food has not only to be stored at proper safe temperatures, but it has to be cooked properly, reaching the correct temperature to kill any possible bacteria. All of this needs to be recorded daily.

It is not just the kitchen that is involved in the inspections, drinks are classed as food and therefore everything to do with serving our beers and other drinks was also looked at. The bar area, cellar and even our ice-making machine were given the "once-over."

We are glad to report that everything was found to be in excellent order and the EHO was able to award us with a **Five Star Food Hygiene Rating**.

This maintains the rating that we achieved after the last inspection and hopefully gives our customers confidence that they can enjoy the food and drink we supply in the knowledge that it is kept, prepared and served to a very high standard.




Complete the square logically.
