# **Group Information**

#### Sessions

Over the past year Kesteven RDA provided just over 450 riding sessions to 30 riders with the help of 20 volunteers. 14 of the riders were aged 25 or younger with 3 taking part for the first time and the disabilities ranged from Physical to Intellectual Disabilities.

#### Riders

Riding is on a Tuesday with Emily Johnson riding on a Saturday afternoon. The harsh winter has meant a reduction in lessons as the group struggled with freezing temperatures and high winds.

The simulator proved it's worth with most riders switching to sessions indoors.

The Saddle Club has restarted with 5 riders (2 riders sharing a place) and has extended its activities to offering pony care leading to "in house" certificates.

A new venture of horse therapy for elderly people is being launched at the end of May. This will run on Thursday afternoons and funding has been secured for a pilot scheme of 10 sessions.

#### **Volunteers**

The number of volunteers actively involved in the group is 20 with 5 of the volunteers aged 25 and under. Encouraging young people to volunteer with Kesteven RDA helps to ensure succession planning and secures a healthy future for the charity. The volunteers consist of Trustees on the committee, riding session volunteers and volunteers who help with the riding holiday, National competitions etc.

#### **Achievements**



Winner of the Fronerthig Delyn Aur Most Improved Junior Rider 2017 is James Ford. James rides on a Tuesday afternoon and started riding in 2014. This year his confidence has blossomed as well as his communication skills with volunteers and coaches.

James is now starting to ride independently in walk on the lovely Rio and can complete simple obstacles. He managed the transition from private lesson to riding in a group and interacted well with new volunteers.

The winner of the Kesteven Rideability Most Improved Adult Rider is Liz Charlton who started riding with us on the simulator in 2014. Liz progressed onto Murphy in Spring 2016 and the partnership has flourished over the last few months.

# Regional and National Competitions

## Countryside Challenge and National Champs 2017



The Countryside Challenge competition took place at Scropton near Derby and the group took Fudge to compete with Timmy Lynch and to support Skyla Harris competing on her own pony.

Timmy and Fudge was true superstars and took all the obstacles in their stride. They gained a third place in a strong class and had lovely comments from the judges on Timmy's determination and riding skills.

In the afternoon it was Skyla's chance to shine. Riding her own pony, Gem, she rode with style and polish to gain a qualifying second place in the biggest class of the day. Skyla went forward to the National Championships at Hartpury, Gloucestershire where she gained a second place. The competition was very strong with Skyla and Gem completing a foot perfect round to put them into second place with a score of 83%. This was Skyla's first time at the RDA Nat Champs which take place at the impressive venue of Hartpury College near Gloucester. Skyla's mum, Anita, was delighted with the result and thanked Kesteven RDA for their help and support especially coach Sarah Harris for taking Skyla round the course.



## Regional Dressage 2018

The Regional Dressage qualifiers took place at Field Farm near Wymeswold on April 30<sup>th</sup> and three riders from Kesteven group took part.



Emily Johnson and Fudge gave a very polished performance to win the Grade 1 – 6 walk/trot class and gained the highest score of the day on the Restricted section winning the "Penny Tiptoes Trophy".

Sue Ashton and Rio gained a red rosette at her first Dressage competition and Rio's first time competing for RDA. Timmy Lynch and Fudge were placed third in their debut performance at Dressage. Thanks to Nicky, Sarah, Liz and Karen for their hard work preparing the ponies and grooming/leading etc at the event.
