Group Information

Sessions

Over the past year Kesteven RDA provided just over 460 sessions to 31 participants with the help of 30 volunteers. 10 of the riders were aged 25 or younger with 4 taking part for the first time and the disabilities ranged from Physical to Intellectual Disabilities.

Riders

Riding takes place primarily on a Tuesday with Silver Hour (a therapy session for older people) taking place on Thursday afternoons and one rider having an individual lesson on Saturday.

The simulator continues to provide a means to give therapy sessions for those not able to ride and to provide an indoor alternative during inclement weather.

The Saddle Club runs after school on Tuesdays with 5 riders (2 riders sharing a place) and has extended its activities to offering pony care leading to "in house" certificates.

The new venture of horse therapy for elderly people was launched at the end of May 2018 and proved to be a huge success. Further funding is being sought to run sessions in the summer 2019.

Volunteers

The number of volunteers actively involved in the group is 30 with 7 of the volunteers aged 25 and under. Encouraging young people to volunteer with Kesteven RDA helps to ensure succession planning and secures a healthy future for the charity. The volunteers consist of Trustees on the committee, riding session helpers and people who help with the riding holiday, National competitions etc.

Our Trustees

Kesteven Rideability is supported by a board of Trustees who lead the charity and decide how it will be run. We must comply with all relevant charity laws as well as our own governing document. All of our Trustees are voluntary with some having specific responsibilities. Each person uses their individual skills and experience to support KR and help it to achieve its aims.

He provides physical therapy for riders of all ages and abilities and takes part in our weekly Silver Hour which offers access to horses for the elderly disabled.

Rio is the perfect ambassador for RDA horses everywhere as he is patient, intelligent, healthy and adaptable as well as having a kind and loving nature.



BBC Sports Personality of the Year “Unsung Hero” Award



In November we learned that one of our volunteers, Liz Jones, had been shortlisted for the Unsung Hero award for our area. This award is given as part of the BBC Sports Personality of the Year Award and is part of the Inspire programme encouraging people to take part in sport of any kind. BBC Look North came down to the stables to make a short

It was an interesting day although the weather was very wet and cold. Despite this we were chuffed when Liz was announced as the winner of the East Yorkshire and Lincs region. Liz went to the final which was held as part of the BBC Sports Personality of the Year Award but sadly didn't get crowned the “Unsung Hero” of “Unsung Heroes”. Regional Competitions

Regional Fun Day 2018



This was held at Scropton near Derby and we took along Sue Ashton, Timmy Lynch and Lou Talbot along with our ponies Rio and Fudge. The day was a chance for our riders to experience competition away from home. Sue and Rio rode their first

independent dressage test together and achieved first place with a mark of 69.4%. Rio was a little star as this was his first independently ridden RDA competition. Timmy and Fudge came second in their class and all three competitors rode great rounds in the Countryside Challenge.

Dressage Anywhere

Sue Ashton and Rio took a video test in preparation for the Regional RDA competition in April. This was their first attempt at the Championship Grade 1 test and they did very well coming second with a mark of 70.59%

Silver Hour

Our Silver Hour successfully launched in 2018, helped very much by the lovely sunny weather. This was a programme of equine therapy designed for elderly disabled adults to help older disabled members of the community benefit from interaction with horses to reduce stress and anxiety. The programme also offered an ideal opportunity for older people to rekindle their love of equines or to experience a connection with a horse for the first time.



By chance the Silver Hour enabled us to make a wish come true for Babette, who, as a 98th birthday gift to herself, wanted to get on a horse for maybe the last time. The Silver Hour is not specifically designed for the older, disabled adult to ride but as Babette had been an accomplished horsewoman in her younger days and we had a horse suitable we felt that as we could, we should help make her wish come true – to ride maybe one last time. Despite her age Babette was full of determination and confidence so it was hat first then a try out on Lloyd, our magnificent mechanical horse, to see how she managed. A few reminders about sitting position and she soon slipped into rider mode and was happily walking in time with Lloyd's rhythm. Why couldn't she ride again? We couldn't see any reason why not so we selected Fudge as the best fit for her and with the aid of our volunteers the rest is history.



Everyone was so thrilled at her achievement. A short video made on the day and posted on Facebook with Babette's permission obviously resonated with people as it has been viewed over 45K times, shared over 500 times and liked in excess of 700 times.

Kesteven RiDeAbility is all about what you can do and Babette's ride on Fudge just shows that you are never too old to have a dream, or to achieve it.

As the summer progressed many of those taking part have begun to build up real bonds with our horses and it is quite touching to see the effect just being with an equine can have upon an individual. We are beginning this year's sessions on May 19th and already have groups booked in.
