

# Free Design

## Winter Wonderland

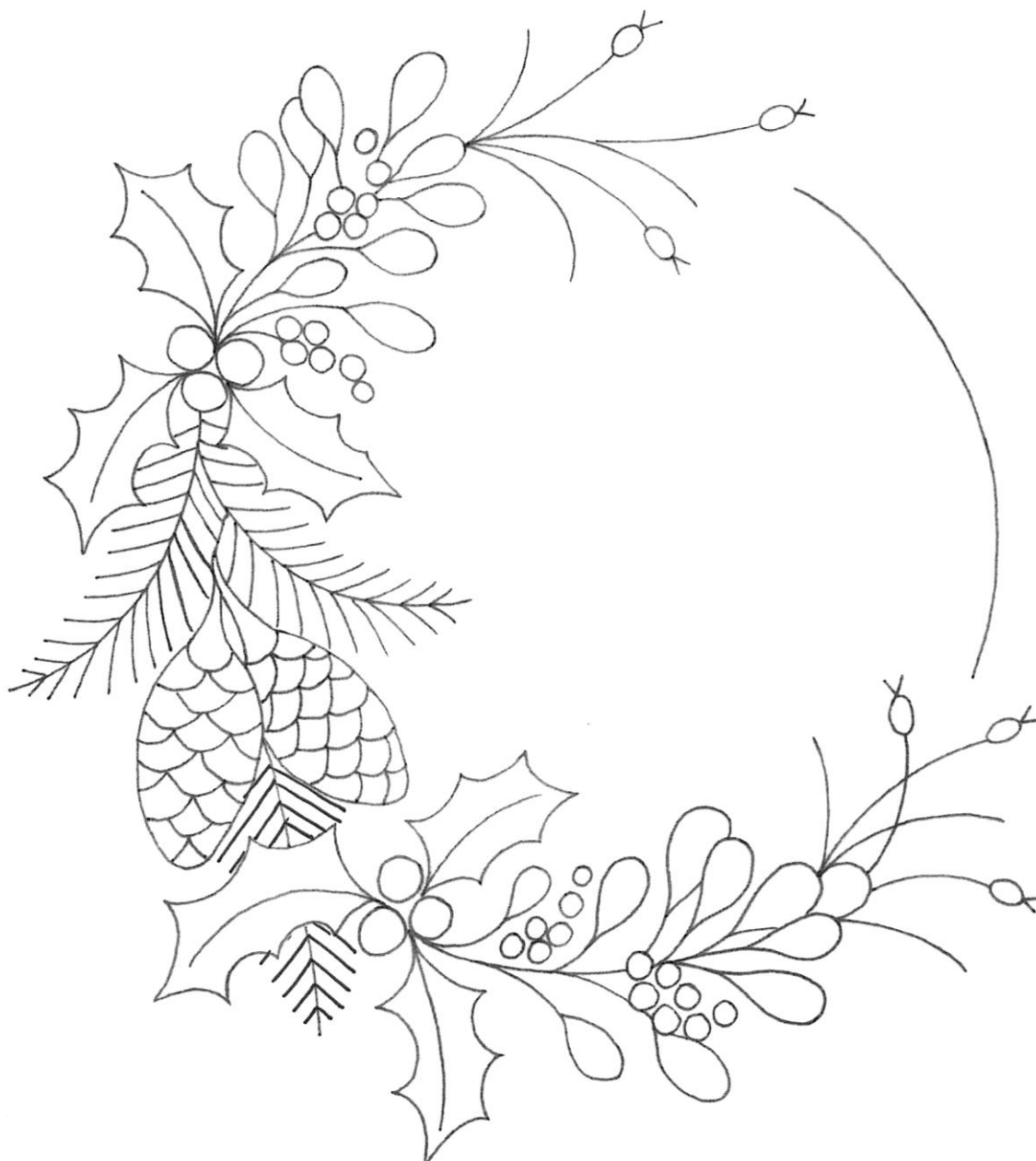
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Print off this page and trace the design below onto your fabric. Go over the design with a black pen first if you can't see it clearly through the fabric or you can use the prick and pounce method or carbon transfer paper.

Frame the fabric into your embroidery hoop; place a cotton fabric behind your embroidery fabric to give you a more stable ground to work on.

## Level: beginners and intermediate

This project uses 6 embroidery stitches all of which are suitable for beginners but this project is great for those who love embroidery in its purest form too! We have separate videos on each stitch if you need more detailed information as well as videos on how to frame up your fabric, how to thread your needles and how to start and finish your threads. ## You will need:-

A printer to print off this design! The outline design is the size I worked.

## Threads

Stranded cottons in the following colours:

- Bright red (**DMC 321**, *Anchor 47*) for holly berries
- Dark red (DMC 815, **Anchor 44**) for rose hip berries
- Lime Green (**DMC 907**, *Anchor 255*) for mistletoe leaves and holly leaf stems
- Light green (DMC 3346, **Anchor 267**) for mistletoe leaves
- Mid green (**DMC 3345**, *Anchor 268*) for holly leaves and rose hip stems
- Dark green (DMC 500, **Anchor 862**) for small ferns and pine cone leaves
- Light brown (DMC 422, **Anchor 888**) for pine cones
- Dark Brown (DMC 610, **Anchor 889**) for pine cones and pine cone leaf stems
- White (DMC B5200, **Anchor 1**) for mistletoe berries

The above are the colours I used in the video; I used a mix of Anchor and DMC (the numbers in bold are the actual colours I used; alternatives are given in italics) but jump in your stash and see what you have! All you need is 3 or 4 greens, 2 reds, 2 browns and a white!

## Fabric

- White linen
- Calico background

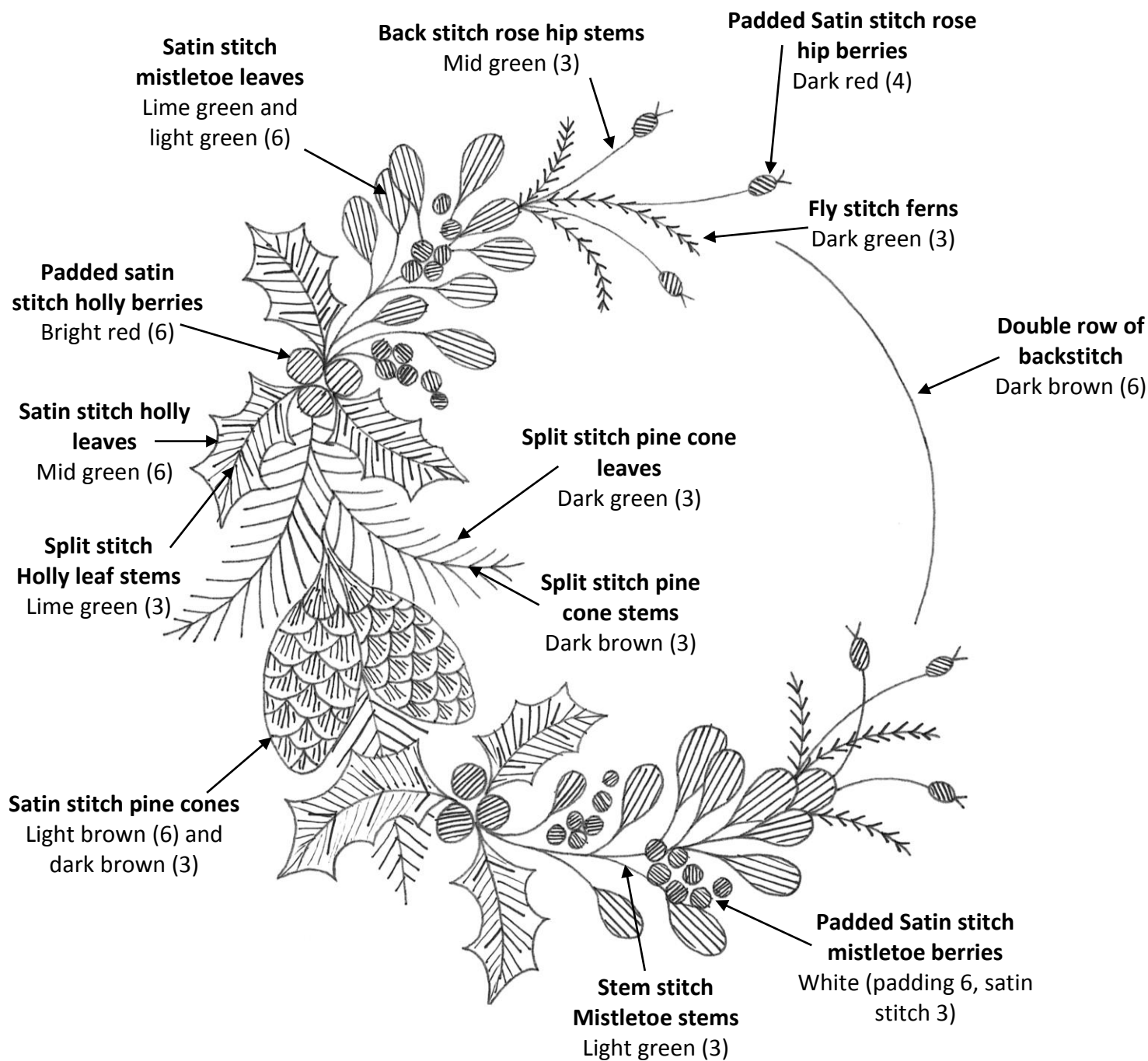
## Needles

- Crewel size 7 – 3 to 4 strands
- Chenille size 22 - 6 strands

## Other

- Embroidery scissors
- 7.5" or 8" Wooden embroidery hoop (7.5" available in the shop)
- Waterproof or design transfer pen
- Versatile table clamp to hold my frame still

# Stitch and colour plan (number of strands used in brackets)



The two sprigs repeat themselves, so I have worked just one in the video to show you what to do. You can work them together or one first then the other as I have done.
