## Introduction

At the Men's Committee meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> June 1999, and in agreement with the Ladies Committee, it was decided that a set of Rules & Regulations were required to embrace all competitions played at Silverstone Golf Club that are organised, managed and controlled by, or on behalf of, the Men's Committee and/or the Ladies Committee, or the Senior Men's Committee. and on behalf of members of Silverstone Golf Club (2005)Ltd

This document defines these Rules and Regulations so that all members of SGC have a clear understanding of what is required of themselves and the organising committee(s).

If there is a dispute relating to the organisation, management and/or result, of any competition, the decision of the Men's Committee (or Ladies' or Seniors' Committee where appropriate) shall be final and binding.

Failure to abide by any of the Rules & Regulations will result in the automatic disqualification of the offending competitor(s).

## General

### Rules:

All competitions will be played in accordance with the latest issue of The Rules of Golf as published by The Royal and Ancient Golf Club, St. Andrews, Scotland. It is the members' responsibility to familiarise themselves with, and to understand and abide by, these rules. If members require clarification on any point relating to the Rules of Golf, the SGC Professional and/or any Committee member is willing to help.

### Competition Times:

A block of times will be allocated to each competition. Any player unable to tee off at their given time should check with the organiser as playing outside of the allocated time may result in disqualification.

### Competition Types:

There will be four types of competition:

Boarded Competition – These competitions are represented by an honours board in the clubhouse

Major Competition – These competitions are represented by a trophy being presented to the winner and are not Boarded

Medal Competition – These are monthly competitions which are represented by a monthly award only

Stableford Competition – These are standard qualifying competitions and have no award.

### Handicaps:

All competitors must have a current handicap, issued in accordance with the World Handicap system (WHS) 1<sup>st</sup> November 2020. All competitors must have completed 3 qualifying competitions (54 holes) in a twelve month period prior to the competition being selected for entry.

The maximum handicap(s) allowable are 28 for male members and 36 for Lady and Junior members. Some Senior competitions allow for an increased handicap these will be indicated in the handicap section of the competitions.

The maximum allowable handicap **index** is 54 for Lady or Junior members.

### Competition Entries:

Silverstone GC use the How Did I Do system (HDID) for competition entries, a competition entry book and entry sheets managed by the pro-shop.

All entrants for any competition must have registered their entry in the Competitions Entry Book or with HDID

or the Pro-shop, and paid the appropriate entry fee (where required), prior to commencing play on the course. If your NAME is on the ENTRY sheet you will have been deemed to have paid. Failure to pay may preclude Entry in subsequent drawn competitions and may lead to Disqualification.

Competition Format: Most competitions will be played over 18 holes (except Match Play events) starting on the 1<sup>st</sup> tee. However, the Committee may authorise Medal/Stableford competitions to commence on the 10<sup>th</sup>, or any other tee if they decide that this is necessary. Members should note that there are some SGC competitions that require a competition to be played over more, or less, than 18 holes. Whether the White, Yellow or Red Tees are to be used will be noted for every competition in the Competitions Entry Book or on HDID (or Entry Sheet). These will also be detailed below for reference.

Members must be ready to commence play from their designated starting tee at least five minutes before the time that they have been allocated. Failure to be ready to play at the allotted tee time may lead to Disqualification

## **Eligibility:**

All competitions, organised and managed by the Men's and/or Ladies Committee, are open to members of the Men's, Ladies or Men's Seniors' and Junior Sections.

Lifestyle members.

- ! Lifestyle members may take part in qualifying and non-qualifying competitions. They may not take part in Board competitions, external Competitions and representative matches.

Transferring Members

- ! Members transferring from another club must play in 3 qualifying rounds before they can enter any of the SGC major competitions.
- ! a new member who has not completed 3 qualifying rounds in full would be allowed to play in the competition(s) (and it would count towards the number of qualifying rounds required) but the member would not be accredited as the Trophy holder or placed in the top 3 (three) positions.

## **Divisions**

Each section will split competitions into divisions where appropriate. In General the Men's section will have 3 divisions and the Seniors and Ladies sections will have two divisions.

## **Medal:**

Each monthly Medal will be a stroke play competition over 18 holes and played in accordance with the rules and regulations published by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews.

Each Monthly Medal will consist of 3 (three) division's.(Depending on the number of entries for the day's competition), 40 plus for 3 divisions, 25 or more for 2 divisions, 10 or less will be one division, these numbers will include all entries in the competition book on the day, not the number that completed the said competition.

Competitors should note that play, or practice, on the course is not permitted on the day of any stroke play competition before they play their round. Any member who disregards this ruling will be automatically disqualified. Rule 5.5b applies.

## **Stableford:**

Stroke play competitions, that are organised and managed by the Men's Committee, played over 18 holes, where the scoring is based on the points awarded according to the number of strokes taken per hole and are open to members of the Men's Section, Men's Senior Section and to male members of the Juniors Section. This also applies to those organised by the Ladies' Committee and the Senior's Committee.

The Handicap allowance for a Stableford competition will be decided by the nature or name of the said competition and the WHS recommendation for the said competition, and will be noted in the competition entry book and HDID, as will be the selection of tees. Competitors should note that play, or practice, on the course is not permitted on the day of any stroke-play competition (Stableford) before they play their round.

Any member who disregards this ruling will be automatically disqualified. Rule 5.5b applies.

## Matchplay (Knockout Competitions)

Competitions played under the Rules of Matchplay, organised and managed by the Section Committees, that are open to all full members of Silverstone Golf Club.

Competitors must maintain and hold a WHS Handicap. (this can be found in the clubs Handicap Book or on HDID or England Golf for all sections against your name) prior to the draw and throughout the competition, to be eligible to enter/play in these competitions.

## Summer & Winter Knockout Competitions

These competitions shall be played under the rules of Match Play. It is the responsibility of all players to ensure that they are familiar with these Rules

They shall be played as either singles or pairs, as appropriate to that particular competition, and are open to all Male Members of Silverstone Golf Club with a WHS handicap

Members who have not paid the appropriate entry fee before the draw for opponents takes place, will not be entered in the draw, thereby effectively disqualifying themselves from the competition(s). It is the responsibility of members to advise the Club Secretary, in advance of the draw, if for any reason they are unable to pay their fees before the draw takes place. The Club Secretary shall have the discretion to accept late payment if he believes there are valid reasons for so doing, and his decision is final and binding.

For the Summer Competitions, each match shall start from the 1<sup>st</sup> Tee, and be played from the White or Yellow Tees as decided by the Committee, over a maximum of 18 holes; or until one player (or team) has won a "sudden death" play-off hole if the match is all square after playing 18 holes.

"Sudden Death play-offs shall continue immediately following completion of play on the 18<sup>th</sup> green and shall be played from the 1<sup>st</sup> Tee, continuing in hole sequence until one player (or team) has won a hole.

The Winter knock-out competitions will consist of 3 (Three) formats: Singles, Better Ball Pairs, & Greensomes, These are drawn events

Competitors should be mindful of a winter climate where play may be under time of the essence to finish competitions before the current year ends March 31st . Rounds arranged immediately after the last round is completed may be of benefit to all competitors who play in the finals.

Competitors should note that **all** matches **must** be completed by their due date for each round of the competition – **there can be no exceptions** to this Committee ruling - other than if the entire course is closed for any reason. In this event, the Competitions Secretary shall revise the due completion date and a notice to this effect will be displayed on the SGC notice board.(or emailed / text) Failure to play matches by the due date will mean that the competitors name(s) will not be entered into the draw for the next round and this will automatically lead to the disqualification of the member(s) concerned

**It is the responsibility of all competitors involved in these competitions to make arrangements for playing their matches (not just the first name on the entry sheet both players in singles or all four members of a pairs match) on or before the final date listed on the competition draw sheet.**

The Club secretary will be the arbiter deciding who goes through to the next round following submissions by both sides.

## Greensomes.

These consist of two teams of two players competing. Each Player drives off and one of the drives is selected for the second shot. Players then alternate playing shots until the ball is in the hole. Matches will be played off :

Lowest Handicap 0.6 x playing H/Cap sum + Highest Handicap 0.4 x playing H/Cap

## Medalford

Medalford is played Medal Stroke play front nine , Stableford stroke play back nine

Subtract the Stableford Points from the nett Medal Score the competitor with the lowest score being the Winner.

## Flag Competitions

Flag Competitions are played Medal Stroke play, the competitors use their Handicap Allowance to carry the Flag, ie if their handicap allowance is used up with their tee shot off the 18th that's as far as they can carry the Flag, But should he/she finish the 18th hole with 3 shots under their handicap allowance they then proceed to the next Tee, and continue play until they have played all 3 shots down that hole, where the ball finishes from the 3rd shot is the position where they mark the spot with the Flag, the competitor who takes the Flag the farthest round the course is the Winner

## Texas Scramble

These are team competitions, played under the Rules of Matchplay, normally with a team of 4 players, Ladies or Men or mixed. For teams with less than 4 players, refer to para.3 (e) (iii) below. also all players must hold a competitive competition handicap

They are played off the Tees, as designated by the organising Committee.

The maximum playing handicap allowable is 28 for Men and 36 for Ladies and Juniors. The team handicap is calculated in accordance with the current WHS recommendations.

For a 4 ball - Currently 25% of lowest handicap, 20% of second Lowest, 15% of third lowest and 10% of highest.

For a three ball – 30% of lowest, 20% of second lowest and 10% of highest.

Each player tees off, then the team selects which ball to play – not necessarily the longest drive. Mark the selected ball position with a tee peg, or pitch reparer. The player whose ball has been selected must play first, then each of the team drop their ball as close as possible to the ball marker, not nearer the pin, and play in turn.

For a team of four the ball from a minimum of 3 drives per player must be selected. For a Team of three a minimum of 4 drives per player must be selected. The score card must be marked in the markers column with the initials of the player whose drive is selected on each hole.

When on the green, place a ball marker on the side of the chosen ball and then proceed in turn until each player has putted from this position. (Remember to mark your putt if it is nearest the hole before picking up. Your other team players **must not** sink the putt.) Do not putt out before each team player has completed each putt, as the **first** ball in the cup, is the score that **must** count.

The Senior Section have decided (July 2023) for Senior competitions with both 3 and 4 balls taking part that 4 balls will be 10% of total handicaps and the three balls will be 17.5% of total handicaps.

## Handicaps:

There are three handicap numbers to be considered: Handicap Index as defined by WHS, Course Handicap (Playing handicap adjusted for Course Slope Rating), Playing Handicap – the actual number of strokes allowed for each competition.

The Maximum playing handicap allowable is 28 Men and 36 Ladies. Some Seniors Events allow 36 for men. These are detailed on the individual events.

## Scoring:

It is a Members responsibility to correctly complete and sign their score card and ensure that it is countersigned by their playing partner or approved marker (**Competitors may be required to self enter their scores from the score card by a touch screen monitor if it is set up for that competition**), (or ask a fellow competitor to do it for them), and deposit it in the score card box in the clubhouse immediately after completing play. The person countersigning a score card must hold a current handicap issued by the World Handicapping System, and must be an adult if he/she is countersigning for a Junior member who is playing in an adult competition. Markers are requested to clearly print their name, as well as signing the



score card in the appropriate place. It is the players responsibility to ensure the card is completed correctly. Failure to complete cards correctly may lead to disqualification.

Please see Appendix A

## **Course etiquette:**

Members are expected to abide by the SGC dress code, and to observe course etiquette at all times, particularly relating to slow play.

- ! Members are reminded to always keep up with the players in front or let the players behind play through (this is good golf).
- ! Three minutes are allowed to search for a ball so it may be wise to hit a provisional if in doubt.
- ! Replacing divots and repairing pitch marks are an essential part of good fairways and greens.
- ! After your ball has reached the green move your bag to the exit point for the next tee before proceeding to clean your ball and repair pitch marks prior to putting.
- ! Move off the green and complete your scorecards on the next tee while waiting to play.

## **Winners and Ties**

In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by countback on the second 9 holes in line with HowDidIDo (HDID), followed by 6, and 3 holes until a winner is determined.

## **General Play Rounds**

All amateur golfers may submit general play rounds for Handicap purposes, all general play rounds should be treated like competition cards and be declared before play under WHS rules on either Howdidido or England Golf.

Once you declare your intent to submit a General play round on either system you must complete a round in full with another Member. You should then enter the score immediately on either Howdidido or England Golf, whichever system you have decided to use. You must also submit the card signed by the Member in the wooden box next to the Pro-shop

It is not acceptable to intend to play a general round and decide not complete the round in full. If you do not enter your score after declaring your intent to submit a General Play Round you will receive a penalty score from England Golf via email. If you receive an email they will ask you to contact your club to discuss the penalty. You will be asked why you did not enter the score and be informed whether the penalty score will be lifted or not.

**General play cards are not be submitted a week before Boarded or Major Competitions**

## **Dispute resolution:**

Any disputes will be dealt with by the organising committee and their decision will be final

# Major Competitions

## Mens Section

Boarded Events and Major competitions as designated by the SGC committee will be drawn events. This means that tee-times and partners will be drawn and then communicated/posted prior to the commencement of the event. The intention of the drawn events are to support mixing of competitors and improved scrutiny of scoring. Competitors shall not change their allotted tee-times. Any cancellation or no show should be communicated well in advance so alternative arrangements can be made. It is the responsibility of members to abide by this resolution – failure to do so will result in automatic disqualification from any major competition that they have entered.

It is the responsibility of new members to abide by this resolution – failure to do so will result in automatic disqualification from any major competition that they have entered.

The exact dates of playing these competitions shall be decided by the Committee.

The following list is not necessarily definitive and it may be amended at any time by a majority vote of the Committee. The format and rules relating to most, but not necessarily all, of the major SGC competitions are as follows:

### SGC MASTERS

Format-

The SGC Masters is a 36 hole stroke play event, played from the White Tees. The competition is played over 2 (two) rounds, 18 holes per round.

Handicap -

scoring based on 95% of the players course handicap prior to the commencement of round one.

Winner -

In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by on countback on the second 18 holes in line with HowDidIDo (HDID), followed by 9,6, and 3 holes until a winner is determined.

### CAPTAIN'S ROSE-BOWL

Format-

The Captain's Rose-bowl is an 18 hole Stableford event, played from the White Tees.

Playing Handicap -

scoring based on 95% of the players course handicap

Winner -

The winner shall be the player with the highest number of Stableford points in each division. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by countback

### CAPTAIN'S CUP

Format-

The Captain's Cup is an 18 hole stroke play event, played from the White Tees.

Playing Handicap -

The scoring shall be based on the player's full handicap.

Winner -

The winner shall be the player with the lowest Nett score in each division. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on countback

## CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP AND CLUB PLATE

Format -

The SGC Men's Championship will be decided by a 36 hole stroke play event, played from the White Tees. The competition is played over two rounds, 18 holes per round, over two consecutive days. The Second round will be played, for the championship, by a selected number of players with the lowest first round scores, normally based on the lowest score plus all other players within 15 strokes - both gross and net the committee will decide the exact numbers who will compete for the championship on the second day, after all scores for the first day have been checked). Players who do not meet the requirements for playing in the second round may, if they wish, compete for the SGC championship plate on the second day, The Plate Competition is also open to those members who were unable to play on the first day.

Playing Handicap -

scoring based on the player's full Course handicap prior to the commencement of round one.

Winner –

There shall be (2) two categories of winner – one for best gross score and one for best Nett score.

The Silverstone Golf Club Champion shall be the player with the lowest Gross score over the two rounds played for the Club Championship. The Winner Of the Nett category shall be the competitor (other than the Gross Winner) with the lowest Nett score. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by on countback on the second 18 holes in line with HowDidIDo (HDID), followed by 9,6, and 3 holes until a winner is determined.

## THE PRESIDENT'S TROPHY

President's Trophy is now sponsored by James Gallant the Club President of Silverstone Golf Club.(2005) Ltd.

Format -

This is an 18 hole Stableford competition, there are two categories of competition

**one** is an individual for the highest number of Stableford points the Presidents' Trophy winner

**two** a four Ball Team score (the score taken from the Team Card with the best 9 (Nine) Stableford Scores of each Team Player of their 18 holes on the Team Card,) Being the Total of 36 scores, The Team with the highest total will be the winning Team Score, as directed by the organising Committee, using the Men's stroke index.

Playing Handicap –

Players will use their course handicap with the proviso that the maximum playing handicap(s) allowable are 28 for male members and 36 for Lady and Junior members

Winner -

an individual with the highest number of Stableford points. The Team with the highest total will be the winning Team Score, as directed by the organising Committee, using the Men's stroke index. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on a countback.

## FAULKNER TROPHY

Format -

The Faulkner Trophy is a 18 hole Stableford Competition, played from the White Tees (for Men and male members of the Junior Section), and from the Red Tees (for Ladies and female members of the Junior Section)

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on the player's full Course handicap.

Winner -

The winner shall be the competitor with the highest number of Stableford points. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on countback.

## ***Ladies Section***

### **LADY CAPTAIN'S CUP (BOARD EVENT)**

Format -

The Captain's Cup is a 18 hole stroke play competition, played from the Red Tees

Playing Handicap -

One Division: Players with a handicap index over 36 may enter but must play to a handicap index of 36.0

Scoring is based on 95% of course handicap

Winner -

The Winner shall be the lowest Nett score. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on count back.

**The Captain's Plate** will be awarded to the runner up.

### **LADIES ROSE-BOWL (BOARD EVENT)**

Format -

The Ladies Rose-bowl is an 18 hole Stableford competition, played from the Red Tees

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on 95% of course handicap

Winner -

The Winner shall be the competitor with the highest number of Stableford points. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on count back.

### **THE LADIES CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP (BOARD EVENT) BEST GROSS & BEST NETT**

Format -

The Ladies Section Club Championship, is an 18 hole weekend stroke play competition, played from the Red Tees.

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on 95% of the course handicap.

Winner -

There shall be two (2) classes of Winner, best gross, with the Ladies Club Champion being the competitor with the lowest gross score, the winner of the best nett will be (other than the winner of the gross) the player with the lowest nett score. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on count back.

### **ANN ALLNUTT TROPHY (BOARD EVENT)**

Format -

The Ann Allnutt Trophy is a Ladies Singles 18-hole Stableford Competition, played from the Red Tees

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on 95% of the course handicap.

Winner -

The Winner shall be the competitor with the highest number of Stableford points. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on count back.

## **LADIES SUMMER SINGLES (BOARD EVENT)**

Format -

The Ladies Summer Singles is a 18 hole stroke play knockout competition, played from the Red Tees  
Matches shall be drawn at random. Matches shall be played over 18 holes (or to a Finish) as agreed by each competitor

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on the player's full course handicap

Winner -

The Winner will be the undefeated individual

## **MARGARET MEARS TROPHY (BOARD EVENT)**

Format -

The Margaret Mears Trophy is a Ladies Doubles Better Ball Summer Knockout Competition,  
Matches shall be played over 18 holes (or to a Finish) from the Red Tees

Playing Handicap -

Allowance is 90% of the difference of the lowest handicap player and the other players, based on course handicap

Winners –

Will be the undefeated pair

## **SUMMER MIXED DOUBLES (BOARD EVENT)**

Format -

The Summer Mixed Doubles is a 18 hole Better Ball Competition knock out competition played from the Red Tees for Ladies and Yellow Tees for Men. Matches shall be played over 18 holes (or to a Finish) from Tees as agreed by each competitor in each separate game.  
Pairing. Matches for each round shall be drawn at random.

Playing Handicap -

Based on the each player's course handicap. Maximum handicap index allowance Men: 28 Ladies:36

Allowance is 90% of the difference of the lowest handicap player and the other players

Winners -

Will be the undefeated pair

## **SILVERSTONE CUP (BOARD EVENT)**

Format -

The Silverstone Cup awarded for the **Ladies Winter Singles Knockout.**

It is an 18 hole Stableford competition, played from the Red Tees. Matches shall be drawn at random

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on the player's full course handicap.

Matches shall be played over 18 holes (or to a Finish) as agreed by each competitor

Winner -

The Winner shall be the undefeated player.

## **LADIES WINTER DOUBLES (NON-BOARD EVENT)**

### **Format -**

The Ladies Winter Doubles is Greensomes Knockout competition played from the red tees

Matches to be played over 9\* or 18\* holes ( or to a finish) . \* Number of holes to be confirmed annually by the ladies committee.

### **Playing Handicap -**

Team handicap allowance is based on 40% of the higher player's course handicap and 60% of the lower. Full difference is then taken between the playing pairs.

### **Winners-**

The undefeated pair.

## **WINTER MIXED DOUBLES ( NON-BOARD EVENT)**

### **Format -**

The Winter Mixed Doubles is a Greensomes Knockout competition, played from the Red Tees for Ladies and Yellow Tees for Men.

Matches shall be played over 18 holes (or to a Finish) from Tees as agreed by each competitor in each separate pairing. Matches shall be drawn at random.

### **Playing Handicap -**

Based on the each player's course handicap. Maximum handicap index allowance Men: 28 Ladies:36

Team handicap allowance is based on 40% of the higher player's course handicap and 60% of the lower. The Ladies have two shots added to their handicap as the ladies standard scratch is two shots higher than the men (73 compared to 71). Full difference is then taken between the pairs.

### **Winners-**

The undefeated pair.

## **Seniors Section**

### **CAPTAIN'S CUP (BOARD EVENT)**

Format –

The Captain's Cup is an 18 hole Stableford Boarded Event Competition, played off the White Tees.

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on 95% of the player's full course handicap. Maximum allowance 36

Winner -

The winner shall be the competitor with the highest Stableford Score. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on countback.

### **SENIORS MEMORIAL TROPHY (BOARD EVENT)**

Format -

The Memorial Trophy is an 18 hole stroke play Boarded Event competition, (Medal) played off the White Tees

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on 95% of the player's full course handicap. Maximum allowance 36

Winner -

The winner shall be the competitor with the lowest Nett score. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on countback.

### **SENIORS CHAMPIONSHIP (BOARD EVENT)**

Format –

The Seniors Championship is an 18 hole Stroke play Boarded Event competition, (Medal) played off the White Tees

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on 95% of the player's full course handicap. Maximum allowance 36

Winner -

There are 2 (Two) Categories -Gross And Nett. The Winner will of the Gross Category Shall be the competitor with the lowest Gross Score. The Winner of the Nett Category shall be the competitor (other than the Gross Winner) with the lowest Nett score. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on countback.

### **RICHARD BARRETT TROPHY (BOARD EVENT)**

Format –

The Richard Barrett Trophy is an 18 hole Stroke play Boarded Event competition, (Medal) played off the Yellow Tees

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on 95% of the player's full course handicap. Maximum allowance 36

Winner -

The winner shall be the Player with the highest Stableford Score. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on countback.

#### **4- CLUB TROPHY**

Format –

The 4- Club Trophy is an 18 hole strokeplay (Stableford) Played from Yellow Tees. Competitors must only use a putter and 3 (Three) other clubs.

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on 95% of the player's full course handicap. Maximum allowance 36

Winner -

The winner shall be the competitor with the highest Stableford Score. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on countback.

#### **ECLECTIC COMPETITION (BOARD EVENT)**

Format –

The Eclectic Competition consists of a series of 8 (Eight) diarised nominated Stableford rounds of 18 holes Played from Yellow Tees. The Best score, both Gross and Stableford, is recorded for each competitor for each hole played over those rounds to synthesize a composite card.

Playing Handicap -

Scoring is based on 95% of the player's full course handicap as at the time of playing each round. Maximum allowance 28

Winner -

There are 2 (two) categories - Gross and Stableford. The Winner of the Gross category shall be the competitor with the lowest composite gross score . The Winner of the stableford category shall be the competitor (other than the Gross Winner) with the Highest composite Stableford Score.

#### **SUMMER AND WINTER INDIVIDUAL AND PAIRS MATCH PLAY COMPETITIONS (BOARD EVENT)**

Format -

In each of the 4 (Four) Knock-Out competitions matches shall be played over 18 holes (or to a Finish) from Yellow Tees as agreed by each competitor in each separate match. Pairing shall be drawn randomly on a high-low handicap basis. Matches for each round shall be drawn at random.

The Seniors Pairs Competition is better ball match play with each player receiving 90% of their Course Handicap. After the 90% is applied the player with the lowest Playing Handicap plays off zero strokes relative to the other players. The other players receive the difference between their own reduced Playing Handicap and that of the player with the lowest Playing Handicap.

The Seniors Singles Competition is match play with 100% course handicap allowance on the day .

Playing Handicap –

Course Handicaps apply up to a maximum of 28 strokes. In Pairs Competitions the handicap allowance is 90% of the Differences.

Winner(s) –

Will be the undefeated individual or team
