WHY A NEWSLETTER?

The Oru Paanai committee has decided to send out a regular new sletter from February 2012 to all it's regular supporters who donate to OP through monthly / annual / occasional donations.

The aim is to keep you informed of all the OP activities and the progress we are making in achieving our aim of ensuring that the most needy children in the North and East of Sri Lanka are provided a daily nutritious lunch time meal.

It is thanks to your generosity that we are able to sustain this programme, and it is only right that you are kept in the loop and provided a regular update.

We would also welcome suggestions from all of you on how we can do even more to help the less privileged children living in our country.

Children at school



WHERE WE ARE NOW

From the modest beginning of subsidising the lunchtime meals of the children in 8 schools in the Jaffna district, OP has now grown to the stage where we are helping over **24, 000 children in 170 schools** in most of the northern province, including many schools in the Wannai.

In all these schools, the World Food Programme provides funds for rice and dhal, while OP funds the purchase of vegetables, spices and fuel for cooking. Our efforts are greatly appreciated by all the heads in these schools, some of whom have told us that 'some children come to school because of the free lunch being provided', which is a reflection of the poverty and deprivation prevailing in several parts of the northeast today.

We are constantly receiving more and more appeals from heads of other schools to include their schools in our programme. Financial constraints prevent us from accommodating all their requests, but we will re-double our efforts to raise more funds so that we will be able to not turn down any deserving request we receive.

We hope to increase the number of children we feed to 30, 000 from February 2012. We had been involved with a small number of schools in the eastern province as well, but now the World Food Programme has pulled out of the east and the government has taken on the task of providing meals for all children up to standard 5 in all



schools in the province, our involvement has ended.

We will continue to seek out ways of spreading our programme to the eastern province and elsewhere.

HOW DO WE FINANCE THE ORU PAANAI PROGRAMME?

The main source of income for Oru Paanai is the regular donations made by standing order. We raise about £1,000 per month from these donations.

The cost of providing the lunch time meals for 24,000 children amounts to about £25,000 per year, which leaves us with a shortfall of £ 12,000 per annum.

The many fund-raising activities

undertaken by a number of enthusiastic and generous people, enable us to bridge this gap - this year's fund raising efforts raised about £10,000 in total.

Occasional one off contributions from friends and family in other countries like Australia, Canada and the US also have made our task so much easier.

At present, Oru Paanai has about £26,000 in it's UK account, which would be just enough to balance the books, if this year's fund raising events also raise a similar amount to last year. We would greatly welcome more regular contributors, as this would ensure a guaranteed income.

A detailed financial statement, showing the income and expenditure for 2011 is being prepared at the moment and will be sent to all donors in the next few weeks. A summary appears on the back page of this newsletter. However, it is worth mentioning at this point that **OP does not incur any administrative costs at all, and with the exception of the salary paid to our representative in Jaffna, Ms. Anusha Devi, every penny donated to OP goes to feeding the children, as all the admin work is done by our committee on a voluntary basis.**

Oru Paanai - Sri Lankan branch - launched

Oru Paanai, which was established as a UK based charity, has now opened a branch in Sri Lanka, with the aim of tapping into the goodwill of generous Sri Lankans from all communities.

The Sri Lankan branch has been gazetted as a recognised charity in Sri Lanka, a status similar to that of the UK parent body.

Able led by the former Chairman of George Steuarts, S. Skandakumar (President), the Sri Lankan committee, which includes Dr. Nimalsiri Mendis (Secretary), Mrs. Nirmali Mendis, Dr. Sandy Musaffer, Mrs Wiranti Musaffer and Ms Vas Nallathamby, has been very successful in raising funds within Sri Lanka to support Oru Paanai, with

most funds being solicited through friends and contacts.

The parent committee of Oru Paanai wishes to place on record its sincere appreciation of the wonderful efforts of the Sri Lankan branch and express our deep gratitude to the many Sri Lankans who have contributed so willingly and generously to Oru Paanai.

Oru Paanai Kaithady Project

The OP Kaithady Project will function as a financially separate entity within Oru Paanai.

We feel privileged to be associated with this very worthy Project, led by Dr. Tony Sirimanne, Mr. Ranjit Thambiraja and Dr. Deutram Thambapillai, amongst others.

The OP Committee is confident that our association with the Project, will help to meet another great unmet need in Northeast Sri Lanka.

With your continuing support, we are confident that we will attain our stated objective of feeding the underprivileged children in the land of our birth.

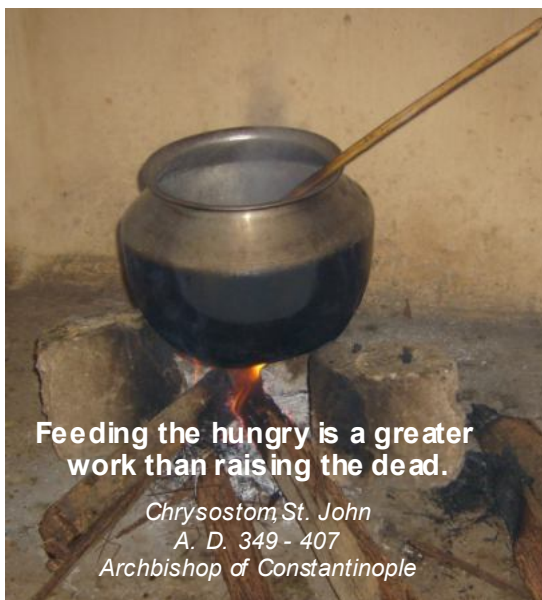
