Ongoing activities of OP

◆ The main focus of OP's activities remains ensuring food security, which is particularly relevant in the prevailing serious economic challenges confronting people living in Sri Lanka at present.

OP provides 4 weekly supplies of dry rations – rice, wheat flour, dhal and sugar. These pothis (packets) are distributed through 19 centres in the north, east and upcountry. A total of around 1,250 elderly destitute or disabled men and women receive such support.

While the majority of recipients are elderly, we also help a few younger physically disadvantaged persons or those in exceptional poverty.

◆ Provision of Sathu Maa, a nutritional supplement, to severely malnourished children continues through MOH offices in several parts of the Jaffna peninsula, at a cost of 1.3 million LKR per month. Around 1,000 preschool children are provided Sathu Maa through this scheme.



♦ The construction of wells, both conventional as well as tube wells continues apace. OP works in conjunction with Well Being, another charity involved in the construction of wells. Over 175 wells have been constructed so far and we plan to construct around twenty wells in the coming months.

♦ OP has been supporting educational activities in underdeveloped areas by providing computer equipment and Smart boards on an ongoing basis. In addition, we have contributed to conducting remedial classes in maths, science and English in the eastern province.

With a steep increase in the cost of school books and accessories such as school bags and shoes, financial support was extended to identified families to protect the dignity of the school-going child. Donations from some donors specified that they should be used for this particular purpose.

New initiatives

♦ OP has started helping a new group of needy people in the last month. We have realized that there are young families, often headed by a single parent, who are struggling to provide even a single meal a day to their young children, as a result of the huge increase in the cost of living.

The trustees decided at a recent meeting to provide dry rations to these families, two packs (pothis) every four weeks. At present, the needlest families have been identified with the help of social services, and we hope to start distributing pothis in the coming weeks.

♦ Recently, we have started contributing a monthly sum of LKR 75,000 to a project initiated in Batticaloa by Science Navigators, an organization headed by Dr. Arulnithy, Consultant Physician. Under this project , 18 'A'Level students from rural villages in the district, are being coached for their exams in Batticaloa, with all expenses including tuition, housing and meals being provided free of charge. It is expected that this project will run for two years.

Supervision of OP activities

◆ The trustees of OP actively monitor how our activities are conducted in the various areas by personally visiting them on a regular basis. In the first few months the OP Centres were visited by Dan and Leela Muthuveloe, Devendra, Shyamala Devendra, Kathirgamanathan and Ranjit Thambyrajah − all trustees of OP UK, and Somasunderam Skandakumar, chairman of OP Sri Lanka. The following pictures illustrate some of the trustees visiting our centres in the last few months. It is also worth mentioning that the expenses incurred on these visits were borne by the trustees themselves.

Forthcoming fundraising event

◆ A Bharatha Natyam concert by three students of Puskala Gopal: Suresh Swaminathan, Sashvitha Swaminathan and Abirami Namasivayam - is to be staged in on Saturday 16th September 2023.

It promises to be a very exciting event, and we would welcome the support of all OP wellwishers for it.

More details like ticket prices, venue etc will be circulated to all in our database in the near future.







Annathanams and Oru Paanai

◆ OP has been arranging thanksgiving Annathanams for 50 or so people at 3 different sites. Prayers / blessings are said in memory of loved ones or thevarams sung before the meals. These annathanams have proved popular and many OP supporters have availed of this facility to mark birthdays, death anniversaries, wedding anniversaries etc.

The charge for providing a vegetarian meal for 50 people has been £50 up to now. However, with the rising cost of rice and vegetables in Sri Lanka, this will need to be revised upwards in the coming months.
