## Guidelines for dealing with an incident/accident (Revised May 2020)

- Stay calm but act swiftly and observe the situation. Is there danger of further injuries to the person, yourself or others?
- Listen to what the injured person is saying.
- Listen to what others are saying if they observed the situation and the injured person cannot inform you.
- Alert the first aider who should take appropriate action for minor injuries.
- In the event of an injury requiring specialist treatment, call the emergency services.
- Deal with the rest of the group and try to ensure that they are adequately supervised.
- Do not move someone with major injuries. Wait for the emergency medics.
- Contact the injured person's parent/carer.
- Complete an incident/accident report form.
