Discipleship

Our Friday discipleship group continues to grow spiritually. In the last 6 months, we have seen amazing answers to prayer resulting in new spiritual freedoms. Even unbelievers, for whom we have prayed, are being positively affected. Prayer is God's tool for evangelism!

Having concluded the pattern of the Tabernacle teaching, we are moving on to consider how that divine pattern still governs when we embrace the principles of the Kingdom of God. It is challenging enough to consider that we entered into Almighty God's Kingdom, taking on a completely new citizenship - a kingdom which is everything other than the dark and dead kingdom of the world we left behind. But, there is another challenge. Today, as darkness pushes back to eradicate Christianity, how much of the Kingdom of God has infiltrated the blood stream of our lives, steering and controlling belief, attitude and conduct?

Kingdom-life changes us. The wonderful Holy Spirit takes the Word of God and renews our minds and transforms our hearts. If Kingdom power is active, it is seen (Matthew 5:14). It is a volcanic eruption of power and authority that refuses to be hidden, and irritates those who live in darkness. If only we could grasp that the Kingdom of God (His glorious righteousness, rule, reign and healing benefits) is designed to combust into a lava flow of irrepressible Holy Spirit life within us and outflow as salt and light to rescue an utterly lost world. The Kingdom of God is definitely not of this world (John 18:36) and dualcitizenship is definitely not offered. It is a Kingdom of penetrating light where humility and meekness forge a path of righteousness. It is a Kingdom that commands spiritual discipline and order. Such is its priceless value - to lay hold of it, it will cost all and everything. What a message Jesus presents in the "Sermon on the Mount" in Matthew 5-7. We cannot wait to get started!
