Dear Prayer Partner

From time to time, we are all reminded of experiences that we encountered as children. In the recent reviews of the life of the Duke of Edinburgh, there were several clips taken from the Fifties when we were watching black and white TV that consisted of a huge box, normally in the corner of a room.

My memories of my early years TV experience are numerous, but I do recall that on the occasions when transmission failed, there was inevitably a

notice that read 'Normal service will be resumed as soon as possible'.



Remember those days? Perhaps not unlike the season that we find ourselves in at the present time?

As we hopefully start to anticipate the easing of Covid restrictions, I thought it time to send out a News/Prayer letter to keep the Flame family up to date with all that has been happening over these past weeks and months, and to alert you to plans that are being made for the future. I am so arateful to those of you who have kept in touch and maintained your prayer and financial support in what has been a very challenging season.

Flame is still 'afloat' and if anything, re-energised as we look forward to fulfilling our call to mission, anticipating the days that lie ahead. To extend the nautical analogy, we are trimming our sails and setting course for new horizons!

We did change gear in terms of our operations. Both Jackie and Calin are temporarily furloughed, which means that 'yours truly' has been trying to cover, with some assistance in the accounts and bookings departments. Apologies therefore if some of the responses from Flame have been slower than usual but, coupled with a very temperamental printer and technological limitations of the user(!), we have managed. Stewart Hills, a trusted and good friend of Flame has come to the rescue on several occasions and I am most grateful to him for his assistance.

As the BBC often said, 'normal service will be resumed as soon as possible', but we are taking measures to keep our overheads to a minimum and yet still ensure good governance and administration. As intimated in a previous newsletter, we are transferring our office base and using 'home administration' as a temporary measure, but the telephone line and P.O. Box address will still operate as normal

Yet, most wonderfully, our ministry and various mission involvements have continued without too much disruption, although we have had to adapt and devise new means of communication and support. I have been very active in recording messages, bulletins and other liaisons.

Chaplaincy Support

Our Chaplaincy work, under the direction of Gerry Denston has also flourished. I asked Gerry for an update, and he writes:

'Over the last year, we have maintained contact with Invictus School chaplains, and they in turn have kept in touch with their schools throughout. Flame Trust commissioned a video from Searchlight Theatre Company and Saltmine for our use in the Christmas assemblies, concluding with a message from Dave.

In recent months, chaplains have been called on at various levels and a few months ago were involved in providing comfort and support in the aftermath of a terrible car crash that resulted in the death of the young driver and three teenage passengers.

In March this year, we have been asked if we can help find a suitable building to house alternative education provision for Key Stage 3 pupils and to date, two church possibilities are being explored. We are also hopeful that a school in Pedmore, near Stourbridge, will have chaplains in situ before the end of term and this would

mean we are supporting 6 schools being covered at lunchtime for all or part of the week.

Please pray that normal chaplaincy service will be resumed before the end of the Summer term'.

Q3 Academy

It seems incredible to realise that my journey with the Q3 Academy project began 16 years ago, and subsequently, my journey with Q3 Langley, another brand new school, commenced 5 years ago.

I am reminded of this because this is the term when we say goodbye to those Year 7s who have quickly become our Year 11s! My sadness is that my personal contact with this cohort of students has inevitably been challenged by the Covid pandemic as we have not been allowed to visit the school, and mv input has been via Zoom. But it has been a real privilege to enhance their understanding of all that is good, right and true, and I shall endeavour to do just that in a Leaving Address in a few weeks time as they move on for the next part of their life/career development.

My fervent prayer is that they will

remember those vital elements of Christian values as they stand up and are counted in their future lives.

As Chair of Langley, I intend to continue, particularly as we are about to commission a brand new development on site that has provided us with a beautiful theatre and dining complex, plus extra teaching and learning facilities. Again, I have watched this develop and am entertaining ideas as to how we can maximise these new facilities for the enhancement of our work in the immediate community.

The Playground Project

You will be aware of the Playground project that we launched two years ago, to provide a new outdoor facility in a children's' home in Northern Romania that serves the needs of those with physical and learning disabilities.

Delayed because of Covid, it nevertheless came back on track at the end of last year, and is now fully constructed and in use, providing a wonderful

facility. Many of you know Calin, my Practical Assistant in Flame, and he has driven this project through with great enthusiasm, particularly as it is situated only a stone's throw from where he spent his first 19 years in an orphanage in challenging conditions.

Through the generosity of the Flame family, the project was completed within budget and was also featured on Romanian TV and in the local press. Calin

The furlough scheme has helped, but that is shortly coming to a conclusion and, moving forward, I do need to re-commission Jackie and Calin. One last request. As you know, we normally organise a Spring Break in the early part of each
