

St Barnabas – Fundraising

Shops

St Barnabas has 26 charity shops across the county, each of which has its own unique style. The shops sell donated items from generous supporters. The Retail team also sells some items online (including their own gin made in collaboration with Bottomley Distillery in Louth) just follow the link on their website. Volunteers are the backbone of the Retail team, with around 100 additional people offering their support during the first lockdown.

Lottery

St Barnabas runs a lottery, costing just £1 each week. A guaranteed £1,000 is won weekly, with the possibility of someone also winning a rollover prize worth up to £7,000. The Hospice also sells scratch cards in their shops and online and run raffles twice a year.

Challenges

Many people choose to raise money for the Hospice while taking on a challenge. There are a range of challenges: running, hiking, cycling, swimming, skydiving, and more! Supporters are also welcome to pick their own challenge to raise money.

Events

Before the coronavirus pandemic, the Hospice ran events such as the Colour Dash and Moonlight Walk to raise money. These are temporarily paused, hopefully resuming shortly.

Gifts in Wills

Many people choose to leave money to St Barnabas in their will. A recent legacy gift to St Barnabas is helping to fund a new Wellbeing Centre in Boston.

Donations

Often supporters make donations directly to the Hospice. This may be as a regular monthly payment, a one-off gift, a donation towards an appeal, or a donation on a special occasion.

It was lovely to see Margaret H back with us for Holy Communion on Wednesday. We thank God for how far He has brought her and pray He will continue to help her achieve a full recovery.
