Rev. Andrew Hollins' sabbatical (5th May to 5th August 2025)

This Article has been repeated—from the March newsletter

The Methodist Church requires its ministers to take regular sabbaticals as a release from ordinary ministerial duties. In addition to normal holidays, sabbaticals enable the pursuit of an approved programme of study, research, work or experience as part of continuous ministerial development and for re-equipping, refreshment and renewal. Lasting three months, sabbaticals are normally granted every seven years. They are intended to be beneficial both for the individual minister and for the health of the wider Church, significantly enhancing the ministry of the whole people of God.

As sabbaticals need to be carefully planned well in advance, I have been working with an appointed Sabbatical Support Group. The sabbatical prospectus which I submitted to the Northampton Methodist District sabbaticals committee included plans for me to lead a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, undertake British Sign Language training, visit the Nixon Memorial Hospital in Sierra Leone, and also to give serious consideration to my personal circumstances and provision for retirement in a few years' time. The continued situation in the Holy Land means that the pilgrimage is highly unlikely to go ahead.

Whilst I am away on sabbatical I will be out of contact for any matters relating to the local churches and Stamford Circuit. The Chair of the Northampton Methodist District, Rev. Dr. Sonia Hicks, will be the acting Superintendent Minister. However, on a day-to-day basis, Rev. Bekkie Wright will be leading the circuit, supported by one of our supernumerary ministers, Rev. Paul Cockburn.

Each of the churches which Andrew has direct pastoral charge of have been represented on the Sabbatical Support Group. Those representatives (named below) will be the **first point of contact** for any matter which may require the attention of Bekkie, Paul and/or Sonia. They will also ensure that any information which they think that I would want to be aware of is passed on to me, e.g. so that I can be praying for significant pastoral concerns.

Please pray for the children stepping out in faith and their families.

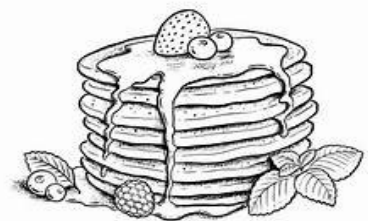


Bourne Methodist Church Pancake Morning

April Lambs

I saw the sheep with their lambs and thought of the Lamb of God. Katherine Tynan. 1891

Moses, now 120, hands over the leadership of Israel to Joshua as they prepare to cross the Jordan into the promised land with the words 'The Lord himself goes before you & will be with you.' Deut. 31:8. Centuries later, possibly in the Babylon, in Is. 41:10 we read 'I am with you so do not fear. I am your God do not be dismayed, I will help you'.

In the intervening centuries they had done much to displease the Lord—even worshipping the idols used by the peoples of the promised land.

But God had foreseen this possibility. Is. 1:18 'says the Lord, though your sins are like scarlet they shall be white as snow'. How can this be? 'I have ransomed you I have called you by name, you are mine.' Is. 43:1 & v.25 'I, even I, am He who blots out you transgression, **for my own sake**, & remember your sins no more.' & 44:22 'I have swept away your sins like the morning mist, I have redeemed you.' (I have paid the price to set you free). [it seems a holy God cannot abide having children who are not holy.] That price was the sacrifice of God's Son, our Lord Jesus, on the cross centuries later. But the possibility that this would be necessary in order to root out the disobedience & evil in the men's hearts was acknowledged at the very outset of God's plan for creation. The decision was made that this was a **price worth paying** so a Holy God could not be tainted by association with an unholy, unredeemed people. Later Paul understood this 'God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself'. 2 Cor. 5:18

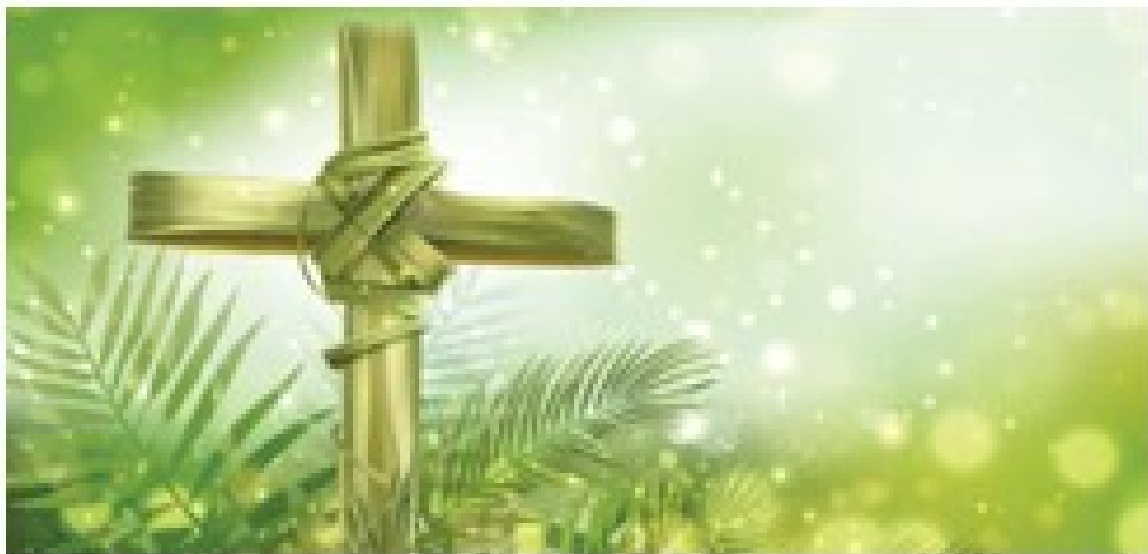

Changes to the Circuit Newsletter

The Circuit Meeting has agreed the Circuit Leadership Team's (CLT) proposal that the circuit newsletter should move to being published/printed quarterly, with each edition coinciding with the three month period covered by the Circuit Worship and Preaching Plan.

Therefore, the final monthly newsletter will be issued for May 2025. The following newsletter will cover the period from June to August.
