The PCC's main role is to Promote the Ecclesiastical Parish of Kenn: the whole mission of the Church: and to co-operate in this with our Mission Community of Kenn, Kenton, Exminster, Mamhead and Powderham.

There are four sub-committees; The Standing Committee, The Buildings Committee, The Social Committee and the Mission Committee. These committees meet as required and make recommendations for the PCC to agree at their bi-monthly meetings.

Treasurers Report on the Receipts and Expenditure statement - 2019

Overview

St.Andrew's has had an improved financial year. An excess of Receipts over Expenditure has been returned resulting in an overall **surplus** of **£6536**

Core Receipts

St.Andrew's core receipts (Cash Collections, Gift Aid Collections, Parish Giving Scheme, Planned Giving, PCC fees and Income tax recovered) improved by £1747 largely due to an increase in PCC fees (+£1521for weddings/funerals) but again remains below the core income level that is required to keep St.Andrew's financially viable in the long term.

Social Receipts

The continued enthusiastic work of the Social Committee brought in receipts of £8447 (net) from 9 events and all receipts (with the exception of Lent Lunch returns) have all been placed into the general funds.

St.Andrew's is very fortunate to have such an active Social Committee working on the Church's behalf.

Legacies

St.Andrew's received no legacies in 2019.

Grants

St.Andrew's received a grant of £1000 from Kenn Parish Council for maintenance of the Churchyard.

Investment Receipts

Investment Receipts remain in line with the general investment market.

Common Fund

The common fund contribution (£18491) was down slightly over 2018's contribution as the reduction in number of qualifying attendees adjusted the Diocese's demand. This was paid in full to the Diocese. Funding this level of contribution remains a significant concern to the PCC.

General Expenditure

Utility costs have seen no untoward increases.

Social Expenditure

All social expenditure was related to the cost of the fund raising events held. (Note: This year's the accounts reflect a presentation change in that a breakdown of social expenditure is provided and a Net result table is included for information)

Charitable Expenditure

This year all proceeds from the Lent Lunches (£824) was donated on an equal basis to four charities: Sight Savers, Mercy Ships, British Red Cross and Water Aid. St. Andrew's also continued to support the Children's Society with a donation of £126 and Samuel Sarkar with donations of £450 for his missionary work. £50 was given to other local causes and £175 was donated to Bibles for Children.

Payments Outstanding

As at 31/12/2019 there were no unpresented cheques.

Foreign Currency

As at 31/12//2019 overseas currency of \$132.00 and €20.00 is held pending exchange in 2020.

<u>Fisherman</u>

Reimbursement of £225.60 for payments made on behalf of the 'Fisherman' magazine in 2018 was received

General Donations

It should be noted that general donations contains a single generous donation of £2500 received following the funeral of Mr Sankey. No conditions were placed on this very welcome donation and it was placed in general funds. Receipts of £380.40 from the superb Bacon and Bap feast (not a Social Committee event) organised by Kate Richardson and Sally Gaydon were also placed in general funds.

Tours

It should be noted that the receipts from coach party tours exceeded £4000 in 2019 for the first time. St.Andrew's benefits from a third party choosing Kenn

as a 'double attraction' combining a meal at the Ley Arms with a historical tour of St.Andrew's. These receipts are by means guaranteed and should the tours be discontinued it would be a significant loss to St.Andrew's annual finances.

Outlook

Current reserves remain adequate to meet St.Andrew's immediate financial needs but despite returning a surplus this financial year St.Andrew's core receipts remain inadequate to support our level of outgoings in the longer term. St.Andrew's continues to remain dependent on the extra receipts generated by social events and to a now quite significant extent the receipts generated from historical tours.

This report on the financial statements of the PCC for the year ended 31 December 2019, which are set out on the attached pages, is in respect of an examination carried out in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 ('the Regulations') and s.145 of the Charities Act 2011 ('the Act').

Respective responsibilities of the PCC and the examiner

As members of the PCC you are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements; you consider that the audit requirement of the Regulations and s.144(2) of the Act does not apply. It is my responsibility to issue this report on those financial statements in accordance with the terms of the Regulations.

Basis of this report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under s.145(5)(b) of the Act and to be found in the Church guidance, 2006 edition. That examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the PCC and a comparison of the accounts with those records. It also includes considering any unusual items or disclosures in the financial statements and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
