

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE **PENRYN WEEK COMMITTEE HELD ON MONDAY 3RD APRIL 2017 IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, TOWN HALL, PENRYN AT 10.00AM**

1. APOLOGIES

Apologies were received from Councillors Mrs Shelley Peters.

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest.

3. DISPENSATIONS

There were no dispensations.

4. MINUTES

RESOLVED that the minutes of the meeting of the Penryn Week Committee held on 28th February 2017 be approved.

Proposed by Councillor Charlie Wenmoth and seconded by Paul Renton.

5. PENRYN ARTS FESTIVAL

The Chairman introduced Cat and Rosie to the meeting and they gave a brief description of what Penryn Arts Festival entails and what they hope to give to the town this year and in future years. They have secured a £10,000 grant for the legacy of the Arts Festival but have not yet secured all funding for this year's Arts Festival, although Penryn Town Council have granted them £1500. This year they are hoping to hold lots of different events rather than one big one, with the theme being "Expertise". When the events are confirmed, we can advertise them on our social media accounts and also keep the Arts Festival informed of our events by emailing them our Minutes and adding them our newsletter distribution list.

6. FAIRY KING AND QUEEN COMPETITION

The Fairy King and Queen Competition is being held on Friday 7th April in the Temperance Hall at 6.00pm. Each winner will be awarded £50.00 that they can

use to purchase their outfit for the carnival and the committee will also award them with a sash which they will be able to keep. There will also be other little fun competitions on the night as in previous years..

7. PENRYN WEEK

The Tea Dance has been confirmed for the Monday afternoon and the Sports Evening on the Monday evening. There will be a walk on Tuesday afternoon with a talk on Tuesday evening. Euchre, Quiz and Bingo on Wednesday evening. The Concert in the Methodist Church on Thursday evening will include Four Lanes Choir, Penryn Rhythm and Penryn Badgers, with refreshments in the Church Hall afterwards. Friday Market will be in the Temperance Hall on Friday morning with Chaz doing a History Walk on Friday evening. W.I. might possibly hold a horticultural show in the Temperance Hall on Saturday with the Carnival in the evening.

Penryn Camera Club may put on a 3 day display in Town Hall if the Committee agreed to this.

It was proposed by Mark Snowdon and seconded by Mts Gill Grant to invite the Camera Club to use the Town Hall for 3 days during Penryn Week.

8. MOCK MAYOR

It was hoped to hold this event again this year on 30th September but on a shortened time scale. An email is to be sent to Simon Reed asking his ideas and if he is keen to organise it again this year.

9. BOROUGH BURGER

As last year's organisers were unavailable to organise this again for this year, it was agreed not to hold it within Penryn Week.

10. GIG@GLASNEY

The secretary updated the Committee on what has happened so far. Seven out of nine acts have confirmed their attendance on the day. The stage and PA has been organised. Three toilets have been ordered. St Ives Brewery will be supplying the beer tent and food trailers have been confirmed. A face painter has been booked; just now need to book some bouncy castles and children's entertainment.

11. CHRISTMAS CONCERT AND LIGHT SWITCH ON

The Chairman of the Christmas Lights Committee, Mark Snowdon, mentioned about bringing the Switch On forward to the last week in November. This would

be decided at the next Christmas Lights AGM. However, it was agreed that the Christmas Concert would remain on the first Sunday of December and now would be a good time to start booking the choirs for the concert.

12. A.O.B.

Charlie Wenmoth suggested that as the theme for most of the events this year was bees and butterflies, and that the children from Penryn Primary Academy had been sent home with their own sunflower seeds to grow, that we pot sunflowers in the town and invite residents to look after the ones outside their homes. This would be included on the April newsletter.

There being no further business the meeting was closed at 11.08am
