- Nicolas Trefusis history talk will be in the Temperance Hall on Tuesday evening starting at 7.00pm
- The Museum Committee will be holding an open evening on Wednesday to include refreshments in the Town Hall
- The Camera Club have agreed to have an exhibition in the Town Hall. It will be opened by the Mayor on Thursday evening at 6.30pm with cheese and wine refreshments.
- The Boundary Walk on Saturday morning will meet at 10.00am at the Town Hall and will finish at the Rugby Club. This might now incorporate the geocash competition.
