Dear Friends

As I looked around the church last Sunday morning I was struck by how much God had blessed us and how much we have to give thanks for. As June and John shared how God had kept them together for 40 years-"there are three in this marriage"-I was reminded that whatever we do is stronger when God is involved and central to our plans.

As a church, we pray without ceasing for ourselves, for our community and for our world. Recently we have seen God answer our requests in what can only be described as miraculous ways. Dino had been told that he could not have another counselling appointment for 18 months. After a week that he described as "dark" we prayed for him during our Easter morning service. That afternoon at 4pm, Dino had a telephone call from the NHS offering him an appointment for the following week! We have to ask the question, "Who works on a Sunday afternoon, let alone Easter Sunday?" Dino did check and she did not work on a Sunday. It was a "one-off" and she chose him for an appointment because his name jumped out at her from her list.

When Tony went to see his consultant about his failing eyesight he was told that they could operate and get him driving again. But then came the shock. His other eye which had been irreparably damaged many years ago could also be operated on to improve his sight there.

When God answers prayers so obviously, it encourages us to keep praying. However, God is not just interested in the big things but every detail of our lives. The smallest seemingly insignificant concern is important to Him. (Friends get fed up when I pray for a parking space in town-and we get one!)

We are God's children and like any good Father, he wants the best for us.

Between Ascension and Pentecost there is a national time of prayer when we are asked to pray for friends, family and our community. There will be a prayer card on which we can write the names of five friends to pray for and a booklet to help us pray. Do pray and be expectant that God will respond.

May you continue to be excited about seeing God at work.

Our winter holiday January 22nd - April 26th 2017 Spain & France

Our holiday adventure starts on the ferry from Portsmouth to Bilbao. There were very few passengers this year because for the past two years crossing the Bay of Biscay has been very rough indeed. This year was the smoothest crossing we have ever had going out in the winter.

There was one overnight stop at Zaragoza before continuing on to Alcossebre on the Mediterranean coast where we stayed for six weeks.

Each Sunday there was a small group of people who gathered in the 'Mini Club' for a mini service. A few prayers, a reading and a couple of hymns.

Every Sunday at 11am I attended the church in Alcossebre, it is a Catholic church which is shared with the Church of England.

On Friday 3rd of March it was Women's World Day of Prayer and ten ladies did the prayers and readings for the service. The theme was 'Am I being Unfair to you?' prepared by the women from the Philippines. Everyone was given a small bag of rice.

We continued our holiday by staying on other sites in Spain & France, on one of which we had magnificent views of the snow-capped Pyrenees and another on the edge of a cliff overlooking the beach and bay at Zarautz.

On the last Sunday before catching the boat home we visited a private collection of Rolls Royce's and various other exotic cars deep in the Basque countryside.

The journey back across the Bay of Biscay was very calm. We had a leisurely night at Chichester Camping Club site before returning home on Wednesday 26th of April.

Li Heping is released

The 46 year old devout Christian Chinese Human Rights Lawyer who 'disappeared' in July 2015, has been released after 2 years of suspected torture and abuse. *"Li has been sentenced to three years' imprisonment, suspended for four years, and deprived of political rights for four years,"* read a court statement, after a trial was conducted in secret. This effectively prevents him from practicing law in the near future. Amnesty International's China researcher, Patrick Poon, said that holding the trial in secret showed allegations against Li were "groundless and weak".

Li and his family remain under intense surveillance after his release and it is reported that he has been fitted with an electronic device tracking his location.

Please continue to pray for China:

- Give thanks to God for Li's release.
- For protection for him, his wife and family.
- For all Human Rights lawyers targeted by the Chinese Government for their work in defending religious freedom.
- For the release of church leaders, unjustly imprisoned.

Persecution in Afghanistan



- Afghanistan is the third most difficult country in the world to live as a Christian.
- Baptism is a crime punishable by death.
- It is illegal for an Afghan person to be anything other than a Muslim.
- Leaving Islam is seen as treason.
- Persecution is from Islamic extremism and Ethnic antagonism.
- The Taliban, a radical Islamist group, remains active in Afghanistan and targets those who leave Islam.
- Christianity is viewed as a Western religion which is hostile to Afghan culture and society.
- Converts will keep their faith completely secret – simply meeting in small groups can be dangerous even the internet is closely monitored.
- Living the gospel can result in facing beatings, abuse, imprisonment and discrimination.

Please continue to pray for Afghanistan:

- For courage and protection for secret Afghan believers.
- For stability and peace in Afghanistan.

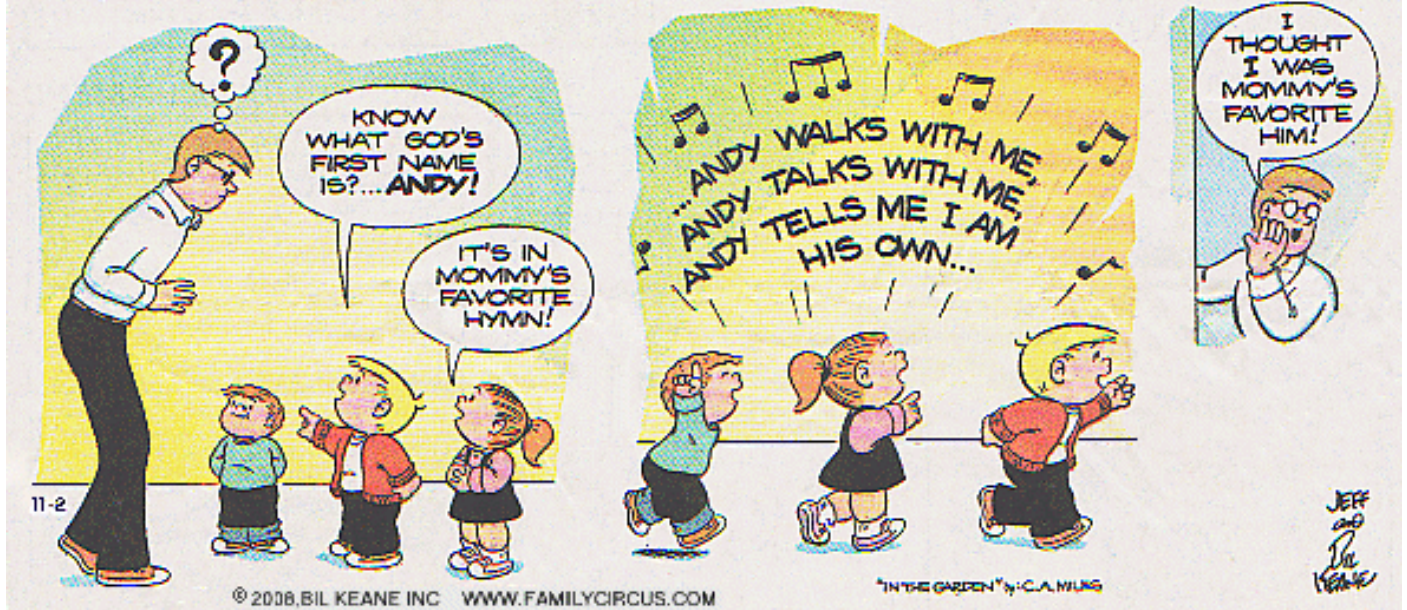
