Aims and strategies for the development of Blaby Baptist Church 2017-2020

Spiritual development

To develop a closer relationship with God through preaching, prayer, worship and scripture.

To have preaching that challenges us to be kingdom people, with individual and spiritual growth.

To develop understanding and practise of the gifts of the Holy Spirit to empower the church to grow and operate in the ways of Christ.

To develop a prayer life that is listening and mission focussed

Worship

To continue to develop a pattern worship for this congregation that draws people into the presence of God, offering Him praise and worship, honour and glory and enabling them to encounter Him in power. This will mean the continued development of the evening service with its more "charismatic" style and the commencement of Messy Church.

Discipleship

To grow in the knowledge and understanding of scripture to enable and encourage a more Christ-like way of living.

To provide opportunities e.g. /Alpha, home groups for people to explore the meaning of discipleship and sacrificial living

Mission

To provide opportunities for people to come to know Jesus Christ for themselves

To be intentional about developing relationships that enable conversations about faith.

Finance

To ensure that our income/expenditure is well-managed to focus on the mission of the church.

Administration/Communication

To continue to develop systems that enable the smooth and efficient running of the church.

To have means of communication that keep the church informed of developments and events

To communicate the mission of the church and its events to the wider community

Pastoral care

To develop a team to undertake: home visits on a regular basis bereavement visiting sick and hospital visiting

Fellowship/Social

To provide a place where people to come together to get to know one another: a place where fellowship and friendship can be encouraged. This may be through groups and events.

Building/Operations

To further develop the building to make it fit for purpose. To continue to have housekeeping systems which support the smooth running of the church.

Hilda is quite poorly at the moment and we pray that she feels Gods arms holding her at this time.


We also want to remember Pauline's mum, who has had a cataract operation and we pray that all is well.

Sameda – divorced and outcast for being a Christian



Girls in Sameda's country are usually married between the ages of 13 and 17. There is great pressure to marry and little opportunity for Christian women like Sameda to meet godly Christian men. When Sameda was 23, she decided to accept a local man's proposal and she was sure it was a good decision. "I married Rashid because he seemed to me a good man. Initially we were very happy until he began to ask more questions about my faith. I did not hide the fact that I am a Christian and told him that God touched my life one day."

After this, things changed. Although Sameda's faith had not bothered Rashid previously, his parents began to influence his ideas about her, over time. Eventually, after the young couple had moved closer to his family, Rashid himself started pressuring his wife to return to Islam again. He beat her several times, even when she was five months pregnant. Sameda remained strong in her decision to follow Christ.

"I told him I would remain faithful to Christ," Sameda recounts. "I can't imagine my life without Jesus anymore."

After Sameda gave birth to their daughter, her husband delivered an ultimatum—"Reject Christ or face divorce and lose your child." Still Sameda refused to deny Jesus. Sadly, Rashid made good on his threat and kicked Sameda out of the house. She and her baby were forced to flee to her mother's home in the city.

To make matters worse, in the next couple of months, Sameda's ex-husband will attempt to take her baby. This is customary in their culture where men are usually given custody after a divorce. Unfortunately, Sameda has no practical means of legal defence– only prayers that God will defend her.

When an Open Doors team visits Sameda and asks how they can support her, she says only this, "Most of all I need to be strong in my faith, I don't want to lose it, to lose the relationship with Christ, but sometimes it is too hard. I need to have contact with other believers."

Sameda's home with her mother, younger sister and small baby is a narrow room of the old hostel, without water or gas, in the capital city of her country. The authorities refused to give them a new flat with good conditions because they are Christians. A couple of weeks ago her mother had a stroke. She is recovering, but is still too weak and cannot walk normally.

It is very hard for Sameda, her mother and sister to stand in faith. There is no official church in the city, so they can only communicate with believers when the Open Doors team visits. *Taken from "Open Doors"* August 31, 2017

Kitchen report:- Have a look down the side of the Church




