

ALNE SILVER JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS



PROGRAMME OF EVENTS - Tuesday, 7th June 1977

- 11.00 am Assemble in the playing field of Alne County Primary School for the taking of the village photograph. If you live in Alne you are cordially invited to come along so that the record may be as nearly as possible 100% of the residents.
- 1.30 pm Meet again in the School yard to parade through the village - children in fancy dress most welcome - join the procession as it passes through the village ending up at Home Farm.
- 2.00 pm The mediaeval plays will be performed on a trailer sited between the Cricket Pavilion and the Big Barn. At the end of the play the NATIONAL ANTHEM will be sung.
- 2.30 pm Mr John Roberts will introduce himself as M.C. and signal the beginning of 'IT'S A KNOCKOUT'.
- 4.00 pm When 'It's a Knockout' finishes the action will move to near the Big Barn where Lady Mavor will draw the winning ticket for the dressed doll which she kindly presented in aid of Jubilee Funds. Following which Air Marshal Sir Leslie Mavor, K.C.B., A.F.C., D.L., F.R.Ae.S., R.A.F. (Retd), Deputy Lieutenant of the County of North Yorkshire, will address a few words to us all.
- 4.30 pm Mrs Clark, the Matron of Alne Hall Cheshire Home, will present the prizes and the Jubilee Cake will be ceremonially cut.

There will be two sittings for Tea and while the first party are having tea the Huntington Scout Band will entertain with a display of marching and playing. If you live near and can bring your own folding chairs it will help with the seating. We apologise that it has not been possible to provide the promised beer tent, but if you would like to bring your own drinks please do so. Ice cream and drinks will be on sale on the field from a van.

Mr Frank Wade, Hambleton District Councillor for the Alne and Tollerton Ward has personally presented a Jubilee Mug for each child in the village - from birth to school-leaving age - and these mugs may be collected at any time during the afternoon from Mr Barber who will have a tent suitable indicated. Please take great care of your mug as if it is lost or broken it cannot be replaced.

The Silver Jubilee Committee plan to give each child a Jubilee Crown, but unfortunately the Royal Mint has coped with the demand and these will not be available till later in the year - but they will come eventually.

A Souvenir Drinking Glass will be presented to all Over 70's in the village. The distribution of these may not be completed on the day but will be finished shortly after the 7th June. If you have not received one and you are entitled to one, please apply to Mr W. Barber.

- 8.00 pm BARN DANCE in the Big Barn. Iain Swanney will provide music and caller and the Dance will end at 1 pm. Entrance is by ticket only - and don't forget to keep your half-ticket to enable you to collect your supper.
