The village will be split into defined areas and each area will have two or three volunteers who are prepared to be on call and do shopping, collect prescriptions etc as requested. This will ensure an organised and co-ordinated approach and will ensure that no one gets missed. In the first instance, we need volunteers from outside the at-risk groups (i.e. not pregnant, not over-70 and without underlying health issues). Please contact David Edwards, who has agreed

18-Mar-2020:

20-Mar-2020:

Coronavirus. There has been a massive response to the call for volunteers for the Alne Village support group, with a total of 41 volunteers already signed up. Alne Village and Alne Station have been split into seven areas, each with its own team leader and team of volunteers. Everyone in Alne should be receiving a leaflet through the door telling you who your support team is and how to contact it if the need arises. 27-Mar-2020:

outside the development limit. This one is for "Outline application (all matters reserved) for the construction of 3 detached dwellings with garages - Land Adjacent Oak Busks Back Lane Alne". 01-Jun-2020: Alne Parish Council has looked at the possibility of private reinstatement of the

bridge on the footpath between Alne and Tollerton. But the bridge is across two sets of private land and the Parish Council would be acting outside the law if it condoned unilateral action to replace the bridge, not to mention considerable cost and potential liability. The replacement is the responsibility of NYCC who will replace it free of charge and at their liability. Alne Parish Council will once again

remind NYCC to do this.





08-Jun-2020: Aldwark Bridge will be closed to all traffic (including pedestrians) from 15-23 June

for deck replacement.

All public gatherings consisting of ten or more are prohibited. D. W. SUTHERLAND, Mayor. Kelowns, B.C., 19th October, 1918.

03-Aug-2020:

Over the last few years, there have been numerous complaints about the dangers and congestion at the Village Hall corner particularly during school drop-off and pick-up hours. Your Parish Council has agreed with the school and NYCC Highways to help solve the problem with yellow lines on the corner and separate bus parking arrangements. A process is in train to agree the details and a public consultation is being organised by NYCC. It is hoped that all Alne residents will support these proposals as being in the best interests and safety of all concerned. It should be noted that the timescale of this process is likely to be protracted but

that it is not within the control of Alne Parish

permission to erect a new portal-framed building, within the existing Material Recovery

Facility, to house a combined heat/power operation [CHP]. The CHP plant is an expansion of the existing bio-mass activities on site and will be generate Heat and Power from forest residues and refuse-derived fuel. The green power and heat from the CHP will be exported to Forest Poultry and York Handmade Brick, making both operations Carbon Negative and truly sustainable in energy terms.

The good news is that they plan to replace this with a future-proof structure similar to the one that exists on the footpath between Tollerton and Youlton. The bad news is that they do not have funds until next financial year and that it may be 12 months before it is actually done. The possibility of putting the existing bridge back in situ as a short-term measure has been looked at but there are


concerns about the state of both the bridge deck and the foundations and the
