A LETTER FROM YOUR CURATE

The church has now entered the long season of "ordinary time" which will see us through the summer and well into the autumn. After the wonder of Christmas, the solemnity of Lent, the darkness of Good Friday, the joy of Easter, and the fire of Pentecost, it's now, just... ordinary.

It does seem a little strange to have a dedicated period of ordinariness, a kind of default season with no particular theme. But that's how life is too – we have highs and lows, but a lot of the time, things just tick along. For many people living through suffering, stress or sorrow, ordinary is what they yearn for.

You've probably heard of the traditional Chinese curse, "may you live in interesting times" – with the unspoken flipside of that, which we can presume would be given as a blessing, "may you live in ordinary times". The second collect at Evensong, in a similar vein, prays that we "may pass our time in rest and quietness."

But ordinary time isn't about nothing happening. The liturgical colour for the season is green – a colour of life and growth. Although times of challenge and change in our lives do cause us to learn and grow, we also need times of rest, of quietness and ordinariness for the slow and steady rooting of our lives in God, and growth as Christian disciples. Ordinary time isn't a time to stop, but a time to steadily attend to the daily necessities of our lives of faith.

May we all live in ordinary times.

Another Happy Member

I was pleased to receive an e-mail from a new member of the Alne Heating Oil Co-operative saying that they had received their first delivery of oil through the co-operative. They went on to say that they had made a "huge saving" of £55 on an order of 500 litres compared with the price they had been quoted by BoilerJuice. This was a saving of nearly 20% against the BoilerJuice price.

Are you still paying over the odds for your fuel?

If you want an idea of how much you could save by joining the Oil Cooperative, please e-mail me a copy of your last bill for oil and I'll get the Cooperative price for the corresponding delivery date.

Out of necessity (I work full-time running a couple of businesses) the Oil Cooperative is e-mail and internet based. If you are not computer-savvy, maybe you can ask a friend, neighbour or relative to help you get started. Once set up as a member, Tate Fuels will, by exception, accept orders by telephone for those not able to use the website option.

Whilst very little in life is guaranteed, we expect to beat the best local prices (as published by BoilerJuice) by between 5% and 10%. And there have been some horror stories, where folk have been overcharged by as much as 81% compared with the Syndicate price on the same day!

We now have nearly 1,000 members, buying well in excess of 1,000,000 litres of oil every year.

If you're not already in the Co-operative, why not join? You will undoubtedly save money by comparison with your existing supplier and Tate's service has been outstanding!
