### The season of harvest festivals is upon us



It's good to know that it's still an important fixture in the calendar of our rural parishes. Harvest is about taking nothing for granted. Farmers certainly don't, in my experience, and I know that this hot dry summer, following such a wet spring, has caused many difficulties for our farming communities, but I think that there is a temptation for many people in our society to take their food for granted in a way that never happened in the past.

There is an increasing disconnectedness between most people and the food they eat. Our generation is more removed from the land than any previous one, with a much greater proportion of the general population living in an urban setting rather than rural; and many people never seeing anything of farms and farming. Urban myths about children thinking that milk comes from bottles and potatoes from Morrisons abound. There is also a continuing globalisation of food production, as with much else. When we eat, we're involved in a vast, complex, interweaving set of life and death dramas as never before. In these dramas we are only one character among many, but no matter how solitary our eating experience may be, every sniff, chomp and swallow connects us to vast global trade networks and thus to biophysical and social worlds far beyond ourselves.

We owe thanks to God and to very many other people for the food on our plates. We should never take them or it for granted. The contrast with many other overseas countries is stark. Crop failure in many areas, has led to malnutrition and even starvation. The picture remains bleak – and that is true of vast swathes of Africa. Maybe the plight of millions elsewhere will give us more incentive to give thanks and to share what we have more generously. However, the increasing use of food banks locally reveals the often hidden plight of our friends and families nearer to home too, who for one reason or another, are unable to feed themselves and their families without assistance.

Harvest Festivals are one way of encouraging our generosity and awareness of other's needs, and once again we will be grateful to accept any food donations for distribution amongst our community and by the Salvation Army.

Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

### Alne Oil Co-operative

Latest (11<sup>th</sup> June) delivered price for kerosene was 46.46ppl + VAT.

Evidence from new members shows that Co-operative prices are typically 20% to25% less than the local market prices.

There was, I understand, an oil theft locally in early June, so it may be time to review your security arrangements. Whilst it's hard to stop the determined thief, there are things you can do to make life difficult for them. If it's difficult, they're more likely to move on to an easier target.

North Yorkshire Police offer some useful advice on their website of steps that can be taken, though do remember that the tanker driver will need to access the tank to make a delivery.

Thieves look for the opportunity to work without being seen or heard, so putting obstacles in their way that make them visible or audible is a good start. North Yorkshire Police also recommend "defensive planting", using thorny plants that will snag clothing or skin, leaving clues that can be recovered later.

To remove any worthwhile quantity of oil will require a vehicle, pump, etc., and time, so restricting access is another way to try to foil attempts to steal fuel.

Of course, if you spot anything suspicious, call the police and, if you can do so safely, make a note of any vehicle registration numbers or take a few photos as evidence. But only if you can do so without putting yourself at risk!

#### Imaginative / Contemplative Prayer

Are you looking for a different approach to your prayers?

Ignatius of Loyola was convinced that God can speak to us as surely through our imagination as through our thoughts and memories. In the Ignatian tradition, praying with the imagination is called contemplation. It is a very active way of praying that engages the mind and heart and stirs up thoughts and emotions.

Contemplative prayer is suited especially to the Gospels. We can accompany Jesus through his life by imagining scenes from the Gospel stories. We let the events of Jesus' life be present to us now and visualise them as if we were present. By paying attention to the details: sights, sounds, tastes, smells, and feelings of the event we can be immersed in the narrative.

Contemplating a Gospel scene is not simply remembering it or going back in time. Through the act of contemplation, the Holy Spirit makes present a mystery of Jesus' life in a way that is meaningful for us now. Using our imagination to dig deeper into the story, God may communicate with us in a personal and evocative way.

On **Wednesday, 17<sup>th</sup> October** and **Wednesday, 28<sup>th</sup> November** there will be a couple of meetings to explore aspects of imaginative prayer. Each meeting will involve a guided mediation on a Gospel passage and an opportunity in the quiet to explore what God may be saying to us.
