## The Greatest Gift of All

I wonder what your earliest Christmas memories are? I remember finding a Tressy doll, in my mum's wardrobe, that I had asked Father Christmas for. Whenever my parents weren't looking, I would sneak up and play with it and then carefully put it back into the box hoping they wouldn't notice. All was well until I broke it! I stuffed it back into the box quick as a flash and had to feign surprise when I opened it up on Christmas Day. Mum was very annoyed that the toy shop had given her a broken doll, it was many years before I confessed my misdemeanour.

At Christmas many people get themselves into a lot of debt trying to buy the presents that they think will show their love to their friends and family. Then spend all year trying to rebuild their bank balance. The TV presenter and money expert Martin Lewis recently caught the imagination of his viewers by suggesting that they have a Christmas of promises of services instead of presents. It reminded me of a story I heard a while ago:

Christmas was coming soon, and Beth wanted to give Christmas gifts to her family to show them how much she loved them. But Beth didn't have any money. Beth thought she wouldn't be able to give any gifts, and she felt very sad. Then Beth remembered that her Primary teacher had told the class that some of the best gifts are gifts that money can't buy. Beth decided to give gifts of service.

Beth made a card for every member of her family, and on each card she wrote something that she would do for that family member. On her younger sister's card she wrote that she would play a game that her sister liked. On her older brother's card she wrote that she would wash the dishes one night when it was his turn. For her mother she promised to watch the baby while Mother took a nap, and for her father she promised to help work in the garden. Her favourite gift was for her grandfather: she promised to give him a big hug first thing every morning for a month.

On Christmas morning Beth gave her gifts to her family. Everyone liked Beth's gifts of service. They knew Beth loved them because she gave them such wonderful gifts.

What a lovely way to really show your love for someone. It is easy to forget the reason we give gifts at this time of year. I feel so happy when I give someone a present that I have made or something I know will mean a lot to them. **But Jesus Christ is the greatest gift our Heavenly Father has given us.** This is because Jesus has helped us return to live with Him and our Heavenly Father someday, by giving His life for us. And just as our Heavenly Father showed His love for us by sending Jesus to the earth, we can show our love for others by giving them special gifts, but they don't have to cost a fortune.

Jesus Christ is our Saviour, the greatest gift we can have this Christmas.

## **Volunteers to establish an Alne Open Gardens Day**

Where I have previously lived I participated in an Open Gardens Day, where a number of local people opened their gardens for the public to look around and teas were available in the village hall. I know there are lots of attractive and interesting gardens around our village, and if, like me, you enjoy gardening, and are curious to see other neighbours' gardens, this could become an annual event for the village.

For it to be viable, we ideally need half a dozen people to agree to open their garden for an afternoon, probably on a Sunday in early summer, when the gardens will look their best. Gardens do not need to be large, but should have some interest. It provides motivation to get your garden looking neat and tidy, and allows others to see and appreciate the beauty of your plot.

A map can be produced showing the trail of Open Gardens through the village, with each garden having a clear sign outside the front to make it obvious.

The event can also be used as a fund raiser for the Village Hall and afternoon teas can be offered. It will provide a welcome new event for the community, a chance to enjoy visiting and appreciating village gardens, and I would be happy to help co-ordinate such an event.

Tate Oil is closed to Co-operative orders for delivery during December and will re-open in January 2019 (our agreement with Tate is designed to encourage ordering outside their busiest period).

If you need oil in the meantime, you can order in the usual way, but the price will be the prevailing market price, not the discounted Co-operative price available for the other 11 months of the year.

You can place an order during December for January delivery, but please make it clear that your order is for delivery in January.

Members can order at any time (January to November) — Tate has undertaken to deliver within 10 working days from order. The price charged will be that applying on the delivery date.

If not a Member, why not join? You will undoubtedly save money by comparison with your existing supplier and Tate's service has been outstanding!

The Alne Oil Co-operative is a founder member of the Lower Swale Syndicate of Oil Co-operatives. Collectively, nearly 1,000 Syndicate members purchase between 1.5 and 2 million litres of heating oil annually.

## **Tollerton Sports and Recreation Club**

Thank you to everyone for your patience. The climbing frame has now been completely overhauled and is back in use. About 95% of the wood has been replaced, making it as good as new. The total cost for this so far has come to £974.82. Thank you to the Parish Council who has provided the funds to pay for this and also the cost of replacing the wooden fence that surrounds this. Over the next few weeks, we should see this happen.

I am currently waiting to hear if we have been successful obtaining a grant from Councillor Peter Sowray, which will cover the cost of replacing all the chipped bark under the climbing frame. This will cost £576 and when completed, will give it a new lease of life and last another decade or more.

I am currently in discussions around funding to replace the swings, so I'm very hopeful that we will see these replaced over the next few months. When completed, we shall be concentrating on further equipment and enhancements to the play space.

Please note that dogs are not allowed on the playing field in the interests of hygiene. Recently there has been an increase in reports from dissatisfied users. This area is purely for sport and many children play there.

Our volunteers will select books to suit the customer's tastes and they can either be collected from the library by a friend or relative or we can deliver directly to the customer every two weeks. Our delivery volunteers are all DBS checked and cover Easingwold and all the surrounding villages. We offer free access to books (including large print and children's), audio books, DVDs, music on CD and information.

Users can opt in and out so can use the service if they are recovering from an illness or operation or can't get out in bad weather.
