COME + SEE

March is upon us...it is the month of Lent, Mothering Sunday and... 'Come and See'.

During Lent every year we are invited to 'Come and See'. In fact, we are always welcome, at every part of the year to 'Come and See' who Jesus is and what Christianity is about. Jesus invites people to 'Come and See' in the Bible in John 1: 35-39.

We can sometimes mistake Christianity as a faith based on rules, especially around Lent. Lent can be wrongly understood as the time when 'we are to give something up'. When actually Lent is a specific time in the church calendar where we take time to align ourselves with Jesus, for self-reflection about what and who we believe, as we remember Jesus going into the desert and being tempted for 40 days and 40 nights (Found in the Bible in: Matthew 4:1-11). For some people giving something up (fasting) helps them do this, whereas for others taking something up can help them do that.

I like to think long and hard considering what it is I am going to do over Lent in order so that I might draw closer to God. Some years I have given something up, like meat, or alcohol. At other times I have taken something up like praying at a set time of the day, or in a new way, or giving things away to help others. Every year it looks different, as it challenges me to grow in my faith and walk with Jesus. I wonder what you are thinking about doing this year. If it is something you do every year, maybe I can encourage you to do something new...?

During Lent we have Mothering Sunday (22<sup>nd</sup> March 2020) at which we remember the historical tradition of workers returning to their 'Mother church' one Sunday a year, often joining their families and mums for the service and day. We take time to remember and celebrate those who have mothered and cared for us in some way and stand alongside those who, for whatever reason, find this day difficult, remembering that God, who is both Mother and Father, loves and cares for us and knows our situations better than anyone else.

And... we have a weekend of 'Come and See'. This is a weekend that will be filled with fun events, with a team from Blackburn Diocese and one of their Bishop's, Jill Duff, learning and exploring faith and who Jesus is. In our groups of churches we are having a **Car Treasure Hunt** on **Saturday, 14<sup>th</sup> March starting at 1.30p.m.** with refreshments at 4.00p.m. in Tholthorpe village hall; and a **prize** for the car with the most correct answers. ## **Church fabric**

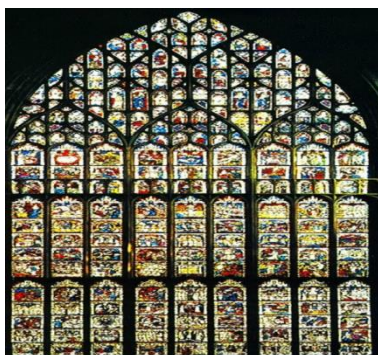

## **Alne Crocuses, Trees, Footpaths and Flooding**

The crocuses planted in the verges along Alne Main Street by local volunteers over the last 2 autumns are now coming through. There is a distinct sequence, with the yellow ones always being first to appear. These 3,000 crocus bulbs should thicken up over the next few years, to create an annual welcome splash of spring colour in the village.

Last year the Parish Council arranged for old tree stumps, mainly along Main Street, to be ground out. A survey was then carried out to identify gaps where 16 trees might then be planted down Main Street, to complement those already in place. On Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> February 4 volunteers planted 9 replacement trees to the east of the Monk Green and Mitchell Lane crossroads. There were 4 pink flowering Cherries, 2 Great White Cherries, and 3 Rowan, Joseph Rock. This was the first phase and next year a second phase will add trees between the central notice board crossroads and the Village Hall corner, to complete the Main Street tree programme. In these times of climate change, more tree planting is one of the most sustainable activities we can carry out, as well as making our street scene more attractive.

After a fairly benign start to the winter, we experienced severe gales and torrential rain over 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> February. This brought down a tree over the river Kyle, with local flooding along the floodplain, and temporary pools appearing in some of the fields. Someone has kindly cut back the willow trees that were overhanging the footpath running east alongside the river along the boardwalk section, which has removed the obstructions and made the path more welcoming for walkers. A big thank you to whoever was responsible for carrying out this work to make this popular footpath safe.

The landmark Ash tree in the churchyard, which is estimated to be at least 300 years old, came through the gales unscathed. It is a very characterful tree with deep fissured bark, well worth a look if you visit the church. Let's hope it does not succumb to the dreaded Ash Dieback disease that is now prevalent in our area.



On New Year's Day I cleared vegetation from 3 footbridges which had become overgrown, on the footpath link east over the railway line beyond Sandy Lane, heading towards the former landfill site. The second footbridge has been reported to the Footpaths section of the County Council as it needs some repairs to missing planks and the handrail to bring it up to a satisfactory standard.

**Tholthorpe WI Meeting – February 2020**

Our February meeting was held in our usual venue at Tholthorpe Village Hall, and commenced with a welcome from our president Dorothy to several visitors from our 'sister' WI at Helperby who were joining us to hear the talk from our speaker for the evening.

We were then treated by Wendy Handford, assisted by her husband Geoffrey, to a fascinating account of their trip through Chile, 'The Andes to Atacama'.

Wendy told us how she and her husband took the opportunity to spend a holiday with her son and his family who were living in Chile and whilst there spent several weeks trekking virtually from one end of this enormous and varied country to the other.



From her talk we learned that Chile is approximately 2,500 miles from top to bottom (though only 150 miles wide) and encompasses 3 climatic zones, each with its own specific geography, geology, flora and fauna, from the breath-taking peaks of the Andes to the spectacular desert formations of the Atacama, and the lush Mediterranean-like area with its rolling hillside vineyards.

Wendy also introduced us, with wonderful photos alongside, to the spectacularly varied and beautiful indigenous plants, flowers, birds, reptiles and animals (of course not forgetting Alpacas and Llamas whose fleeces provide such cosy woolly jumpers, for them and for us!)



Our journey of discovery over, a vote of thanks to Wendy and Geoffrey was made by our president Dorothy, and after refreshments, we moved on to the business section of our meeting.
