Dear Friends,

It was wonderful to meet or reconnect with so many of you over the Queen's Jubilee weekend and, for those of you in Alne, at the Alne Street Fayre. I'm sorry I couldn't make it to all the events happening across the parish over the weekend, but for fellow Harry Potter fans, I'm not yet in possession of a time-turner to make it possible to be in multiple places at the same time.

It's lovely to be able to celebrate together again after the last couple of years. Hopefully, we will have more to celebrate over the coming months, including family gatherings, weddings and baptisms among other things. I also hope, over this summer, you'll have space to rest and recuperate at some point.

We have a God who enjoys a good party or celebration. We also have a God who purposefully rested and modelled rest for us. He built it into our week. We call this day of rest 'Sabbath' in the Church, passed down from our Jewish roots. Jews take their Sabbath on a Saturday, but because we believe Jesus rose again on a Sunday, this has become our day of rest and worship as Christians. Of course, as a vicar, Sunday is part of my expected working week and so this is not my Sabbath. I take Mondays and Fridays as rest and recovering days (or at least try to).

Jesus often took breaks and time for Sabbath away from his usual work and responsibilities. He took himself up mountains or to the beach on the edge of Lake Galilee. Sometimes he went by himself, at other times he took a few close friends with him. Sometimes the only space they could find was in the middle of the lake on a boat.

This week I saw a video in which someone said "Rest does not need to be earned." God taught us that rest is a fundamental part of His creation. We're designed to need rest. As someone living with Chronic Fatigue/ ME I've learnt how important rest is both for our bodies and also to God for our wellbeing.

My hope and prayer for you all is that over the summer months of July and August you may get a little more space in your lives for some rest and recuperation, in whatever form you find gives you joy.

And if our paths cross at any point during that time, please be sure to say hello.

Gary leads a 7 piece band who faithfully perform the Paul Simon Graceland album with considerable verve and fidelity in an exuberant live show. I thoroughly enjoyed their performance at Pocklington Arts Centre last year. Gary has also produced a couple of fine solo albums, the latest **Lost, Now Found** was recorded and released during lockdown, and so has probably not had the exposure it duly deserves. It is a fine album, 10 original songs, well produced with backing vocals from Rosie Doonan, plus some strings, brass and woodwind from colleagues embellishing gentle thoughtful songs. Gary plays various guitars, bass, and a variety of percussion, and the songs with his distinctive Scottish lilt singing all stand up well with no filler. Every track is a good one making for a satisfying and enjoyable album that is highly recommended.





Gary will perform for us solo, playing a selection of his own original songs in a first set. After an interval the second set will be a range of songs from across the range of Paul Simon's (and Garfunkel's) career. Lots of well-known songs that you will all be familiar with faithfully reproduced to fine effect.

The charity also makes grants to local organisations for charitable activities which benefit people in need living in these villages. Organisations must have a bank account and a constitution.

### **The Hospital**

**We help** patients and former patients of the Hospital who are sick, convalescent, disabled or infirm and generally support the work of the Hospital. With just 12 beds it is the smallest NHS hospital but has a vital role and excellent reputation within the local community. We have enabled the purchase of many items that are used throughout the Hospital and Physiotherapy buildings.

They include:

- Modern trolleys, hoists, electric beds, bladder and leg scanners, a dementia computer and physiotherapy equipment
- Flat screen TVs, air mattresses, bedside, lockers, garden furniture, mobility aids, reclining chairs and wheelchairs for patients
- Computers and microwaves for staff
- Daily newspapers, pictures for wards, flowers for reception, kitchen items, Christmas presents for those in hospital then, toiletry packs for patients who arrive unprepared for a stay
- Maintenance of Hospital grounds and gardens
- Refurbishment of the Palliative Care Suite

At a time when NHS funds are under great pressure, our support has made a significant difference to the care and wellbeing of the Hospital's patients and its dedicated staff. We have been doing this since 1969 and will continue to respond to St Monica's needs.

### **Support for health activities across the local area**

**We know** that physical and mental health can be protected and improved in many ways. The recent pandemic and its impact on activities has taken a toll on many people. - Equipment and winter pitch hire for Easingwold Ladies Football
- A new sports pavilion for Huby
- Defibrillator machines in several public locations
- A barre for over-50s dancing classes in the Galtres Centre
- New sports facilities for Crayke and Easingwold Primary Schools

## **Cathedrals Cycle Route**

Whichever English cathedral you visit this year, you will be able to arrive by bike thanks to a unique partnership between Sustrans, Cycling UK, the British Pilgrimage Trust and the Association of English Cathedrals that links all 42 Church of England cathedrals in an initiative to promote greener travel and mental and physical wellbeing.

The 2,000 mile Cathedrals Cycle Route is the invention of academic, entrepreneur and keen cyclist Shaun Cutler, from Northumbria University, and is designed to help us all out of lockdown with opportunities for short cycle rides between cathedrals, new partnerships and fundraising for physical and mental well-being activities.

Shaun, who has worked with Newcastle Cathedral, Sustrans, Cycling UK and the British Pilgrimage Trust to design the 42 linked routes, said:

*“The Cathedrals Cycle Route is about connecting our historic cathedrals and enjoying the spaces between them.*

*“Now more than ever, after a year of living with the coronavirus pandemic, this is a way to support people’s mental and physical health and promote the mission of England’s cathedrals through pilgrimage, wellbeing and heritage.”*

Each cathedral aims to have a dedicated cycle champion to improve the cycle-readiness of their buildings, ensure a warm welcome for visiting cyclists and increase the number that arrive on two wheels – currently around five per cent.

It is also an opportunity for cathedrals to find new partnerships, promote mental and physical well-being and create new links to healthier activities and sustainable travel.

The Cathedrals Cycle Route comes on the back of an initiative between the Association of English Cathedrals and the British Pilgrimage Trust that established a pilgrimage route to every Church of England cathedral taking in established wayfarer routes, other places of faith, spiritual pathways and lesser known pilgrim ways enabling visitors to arrive on foot.

## **Archbishop of York completes his Pilgrimage walking St Cuthbert's Way**

Archbishop of York Stephen Cottrell arrived at Holy Island off the coast of Northumbria on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> June, having walked St Cuthbert's Way, setting off from Melrose the previous Monday. As he journeyed along the route he was praying for the renewal of God's Church in the North. The week long pilgrimage ended with a celebration of the Eucharist in the parish church of St Mary's, which stands on the site of the original monastery founded by Aidan.

He said, "We all know that life is a journey. Faith can teach us that this journey can be a holy pilgrimage where we can encounter God and which leads ultimately to eternal life with him.



This week I have been privileged to take some time out of my busy life to slow down, think and look at what is around me in this incredibly beautiful world that God has made and to enjoy journeying at a different pace. I think one of the reasons we go on pilgrimage is to learn how to be slow, to give space and time for thought and reflection, and walking the 62 miles of St Cuthbert's Way has once again enabled me to do this. The scenery has been stunning, the weather kind, and the welcome and hospitality I've encountered has been warm and encouraging. I have been praying for the Church in the North that we may be holy, that people may see Jesus Christ within us as we reach out in love and service to our neighbours, sharing the good news that life with Jesus brings wholeness and peace."

Archbishop Stephen is a keen advocate of pilgrimages and has walked the Camino to Santiago de Compostela in Spain twice, as well as walking to places in England including Walsingham, Canterbury, Durham and York.
