Remembering

November is a month for remembering: the fallen in the World wars and those who subsequently have died in more recent wars on Remembrance Sunday. Towards the start of the month, close to All Souls and All Saints Day, some churches hold Memorial services so we can remember before God in prayer those we love, yet see no longer.

For me as a child, November has that endearing smell of bonfire and taste of toffee apples and chant like ear worm: 'remember, remember the 5th of November, gunpowder, treason and plot'!

Remembering is made possible through story telling. We do this naturally in families as we look over photos, and as a church family it is no different. Throughout the year our Bible readings tell Christ's story and we continually find our place within it. As we recount all the things that God in Christ has done for us and continues to do, we respond with thanksgiving by our turning our lives to Jesus.

We follow Jesus by living the way he shows us, because we know that it leads to fullness of life: even if at times it is counter cultural and we try to do things differently.

As we remember God's heart for rest, seen in the very beginning of the Bible, God shields us against the 24/7 culture of work, busyness and consumerism. God wants our wellbeing and so we pause, recognise that it's not all up to us, and set apart time to spend with God and with our family and friends.

Centrally at Communion services, Jesus asks us to remember him as we break bread and share wine together. This sacramental act of remembering Jesus' sacrifice of himself has a Hebrew understanding at its core. Jesus asks us to 're-member' his sacrificial, rebuilding love and make it part of our present experience.

Jesus' death on the cross deals with those memories we might have that cause us ruin, hurt or shame and we are invited to give over our sin and remember it no more. Only Jesus' transformative work on the cross in dying and then living brings us hope of being resurrected and set free. The plate and the cup on the altar are reminders of the mystery and beauty of communion that draws us close to God as we celebrate Christ's presence with us around the family table.

Happy remembering!

When Bertie is in hospital, hooked up to oxygen, on regular nebulizers, and feeling miserable, the happiness and smiles that a visit from the play-team, some toys and playtime brings to him, means the absolute world to us.

The charity makes grants to residents of these villages who are perhaps struggling to meet their everyday living costs or who have a particular need. This might include help to pay for essential household items or repairs, fuel bills, healthcare, or clothing and equipment for a baby or children and young people who are in education or training. All applications are treated in the strictest confidence.

The trustees are particularly keen to help people who are experiencing financial difficulties caused by the pandemic or the rising cost of household essentials.

The charity makes grants to local organisations for charitable activities which benefit people in need living in these villages. Organisations must have a bank account and a constitution. Applications can be made at any time using the appropriate application form which can be downloaded at the Alne and Tollerton websites:
