



Neighbourhood Policing

- The 2006 vision:
 - a 'name in every neighbourhood'
 - Neighbourhood Action Panels (NAPs) every 6
 weeks
- The 2014 reality:
 - Over 1000 NAPs a year
 - Plus other meetings
 - Inconsistent and not sustainable





Consultation (June & July)


- 42% of meetings less than 10 attendees
- 73% no police decision maker
- Inconsistent approach across the force
- Attendees not representative of the wide diversity of Essex communities

Our Promises

- We promise local PCSOs will hold a weekly 'street meet' on their patch
- We promise every district will hold five or six Local
 Community Meetings (every eight weeks)
- We promise Local Community Meetings (LCMs) will be chaired by supervisory officer (sergeant or above)
- We promise every LCM and street meet will be advertised on the Essex Police website in advance
- We promise our website will show agreed local priorities as well as the activity taken to address them
