	Members of the public. The Chairman welcomed Anita Robertson to the Council and thanked everyone for attending.			
67/06/2018	Apologies for Absence			
	Cllr. Place arrived at 7pm due to his attendance at another meeting.			
68/06/2018	Declarations of Member's Interest in Matters on the Agenda			
	Cllr. Morrell and Cllr. Place declared a prejudicial interest in Planning Applications 73/06/2018. Cllr. Morrell and Cllr. Place are District Councillors and members of the Craven District Council Planning Committee. Both Councillors adjourned to the public area and took no part in the discussions.			
69/06/2018	Minutes of the Previous Meeting			
	It was <b>resolved</b> that the minutes of the meeting held on Monday 14 <sup>th</sup> May 2018 (circulated to all members) were agreed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman. Proposed Cllr. Bretan, seconded Cllr. Hawkins.			
70/06/2018	Public Participation			
a)	Inspector Lorraine Crossman-Smith, Craven Safer Neighbourhood Team and PCSO Simon Thornton attended by invitation.			
	Cllr Morrell put forward concerns about the recent increase in crime and the distress this has caused the victims. There is also anxiety and worry throughout the village.			
	Inspector Crossman-Smith concurred and informed she had a recent meeting with West Yorkshire Police to see what joint working they can do with patrolling across the boundaries and building up an intelligence picture. The Police are also reviewing out ANPR (Auto Number Plate Recognition) support in this area.			
	PCSO Thornton informed that recent door knocks had taken place around Sutton and many residents expressed their dissatisfaction at the lack of street lighting in the village (be it lack of actual lamps or the ones already in situ being turned off during the night. From this a report was requested.			
	The report looks at years' worth of burglaries and auto crime offences which were analysed to identify the number of offences within the Sutton area that have been committed overnight or during the hours of darkness.			
	Cllr. Morrell asked in view of the Analyst Report if the Police would be supportive in making a request to North Yorkshire County Council for more Street Lighting to remain on between the hours of 12 – 5am. Inspector Crossman-Smith informed that she was in support from a crime prevention perspective.			
	Cllr. Morrell also broached the subject of the 101 Service and the lengthy delays in getting through to anyone. Inspector Crossman-Smith confirmed that the Police and Crime Commissioner has announced that she will be investing £3 million into North Yorkshire Police's Control Room over the next two years to improve the service to the public.			
	Cllr. Green, Cllr. Robertson and Cllr. Bretan informed of other issues in the village which were noted.			
	Two members of the public both raised their concerns over the recent auto thefts, burglaries and requested that the Street Lighting should be put back on.			
	Both the Inspector and PCSO Thornton emphasised how important it was for members of the public to report anything suspicious and let the police know about interested parties.			
71/06/2018	North Yorkshire County Council Report from Councillor Philip Barrett			
	Cllr Barrett on the 16 <sup>th</sup> May 2018 raised the escalating crime levels with the leader of the County Council. A Police and Crime Panel meeting took place on the 17 <sup>th</sup> May 2018 where the matter was also raised.			
	Cllr. Barrett reported Julia Mulligan the Police and Crime Commissioner will be at the Village Hall on Thursday 21 June, from 4.30 – 6.30pm. Visits are by appointment only.			

There is lack of NHS dentists in the area. NHS England officers, which commissions dentistry, and Public Health England has been requested to provide an overview of provision of NHS dentistry across North Yorkshire and how they were responding to gaps in provision.

Temporary Provision will be discussed at the Scrutiny Health Committee meeting in June.

Cllr. Bretan enquired about maintenance of Pot Holes.

Cllr. Barrett informed that pot holes are repaired based on a number of factors including the depth, size and location of the pothole on the road; the volume of traffic; and the speed of the road and available funds.

# 1. Crime – Street Lighting

Following the discussion with Inspector Lorraine Crossman-Smith and PCSO Simon Thornton it was resolved: that the clerk contact the Inspector for an indication of what street lighting the police will be recommending to North Yorkshire County Council to remain on. Also, to inform that the Parish Council feel the best way to get the increase in street lighting is for the application to be Police led with regards to Crime Prevention.

It was **resolved** that following this information a working party meeting may be organised to review the NYCC lighting map.

## 2. <u>Grant Applications</u>

Grant request from Sutton-in-Craven Community First Responders for funds towards a new defibrillator. It was **resolved** that a grant of £250 be awarded.

## 3. <u>Park Pavilion Report</u>

An Area of ground in the play area had sunk making the surfacing uneven and a hazard. The Park Keeper organised a digger to dig the area re-pack and even the surface.

# 4. <u>Community Welfare</u>

Sutton has been highlighted as an area of concern on Age UK's "Heat Map" because of Loneliness and Isolation. A village group was set up with members from the Parish Council and key figures in the voluntary sector working to address these issues. The group have now produced a draft questionnaire and information booklet which will be published in the very near future and delivered to homes in Sutton-in-Craven. This questionnaire will help determine if there is a problem and then how it can be addressed.

A stall has been booked on Funday to raise the groups profile and the need for volunteers. Representatives from Age UK and Mind are being invited to be present.

Crosshills Group Practice are providing staff to collate the information from the questionnaires upon its return.

#### 6. <u>Land Off Wilson/Street</u>

A letter of complaint was read out to the Council from a resident regarding the use of Land Off Wilson/Main Street by members of the public causing a disturbance.

It was resolved the clerk reply informing that the Parish Council are in progress of leasing the land from Craven District Council to maintain it.

Craven District Council have informed there are no Byelaws on the land it is classed as amenity land for the village.

Amenity green spaces function as informal recreation areas. Amenity space is publicly accessible and serves the immediate local community providing a space for children's informal play, dog walking etc.

The Parish Council have no powers to move people who are causing anti-social behaviour this is a matter for the police.

Cllr. Place offered to help liaise with residents. Members thanked Cllr. Place.
