The size of stables (17.07m by 2.95m) is a substantial size and would be better sited near the trees as to prevent the domination of the openness of the countryside.

The current position is detrimental to the views and would erode the openness of the countryside.

Ellers Road declines significantly and re-positioning the stables near the trees (down left hand side as you face the field from the road) would be less of a distraction as the present location would be directly in the driver's eye line.

Rain water running down the steep road should also be considered as in the present proposed position could cause flooding issues.

Concern raised that they may end up domestic residence.

This matter will be investigated and appropriate action taken.

The clerk contacted Public Rights of Way Officers with regard to inconsiderate parking on Hall Drive (private road but designated Public Right of Way) near the entrance to the Clough obstructing access for Emergency Services, Wheelchair users and others  
The officers are looking into signs being sited.
- f) **Bushcraft Courses**  
Emailed to Mr Richard McEvoy to attend the Parish Council meeting to discuss their request to hold bushcraft courses in Lumb Clough.
- g) **Drains**  
Residents complained that opposite the building site on West Lane highways had missed clearing some drains due to obstruction. The drains were outside no. 61 and 67 building rubble has been washed down the drains from the development and residents are concerned that they maybe come blocked.  
The matter was reported to Highways and they have been assessed.
- h) **Playing Pitch Strategy, Open Space Strategy**  
The clerk was asked to fill in questionnaires on Sutton-in-Craven Playing Fields and Open Spaces from Craven District Council. The need for more land for Allotments and a Sports Pitch was highlighted.
- i) **Large wagons reversing and rubble on West Lane**  
Residents have complained about wagons reversing up West Lane without a banksman present and a large amount of rubble being left in the middle of the road at the bottom.  
The developers were contracted with regard to the wagons reversing and the following response was forwarded:  
“Our apologies that this has occurred, we were unaware but I can assure you that we will be investigating the matter further.  
As mentioned previously a banksmen will be used now for all large delivery vehicles. In addition to this our supplier orders now contain the following statement; ‘Please not access is tight to this site and a site visit is advised to ensure your vehicle can access. Please call site 30minutes prior to arriving’.  
  
With regards to the rubble this has nothing to do with the development site and the person responsible has been contacted and asked to clear it.

**1. Lumb Clough – Bushcraft Courses**

A request to use Lumb Clough to run bushcraft courses from the Keighley and Haworth Forest club.  
Mr Richard McEvoy attended the meeting.

The courses are run by trained bushcrafters. A letter was produced from Bradford Council Parks Department authorising them to run such activities. The sessions are usually about 3 hours long once a month. They begin with a safety talk and then an instructional on some aspect of outdoor living such as shelter building, fire lighting or

identifying trees and their uses. Conservation and care of the environment are key themes and endeavour to leave no trace of the session.

The Boys' Brigade group based at Sutton in Craven Baptist church are wanting a course. It is a brilliant activity for building self-reliance and team work and foster a sense of responsibility to the natural environment. The courses are free and all the equipment is provided. The instructors are both Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) and The Criminal records Bureau (CRB) checked and have remote locations first aid certificates (all produced at the meeting).

It was **resolved** that subject to a copy of Public Liability from the Boy's Brigade and a Risk Assessment that permission be granted.

The Boys Brigade to report back to the clerk after the event to let us know how it went, what went well, what did not go so well, any problems that need ironing out for possible future events. Following this further events can be booked.

## **2. Park / Pavilion Report**

### **a) Safety Surfacing**

Damage has occurred to the safety surfacing around the Bloqx area in the park. This was reported to Pennine Playgrounds who agreed to send contractors out to repair the damage.

## **3. Planning Application Notifications**

The District Council will now be sending notification letters by email rather than post. This will help to ensure that Parish and Town Councils receive notification of applications more promptly. Copies of the application forms, plans, and other supporting information is available to view for each application on the Council's website.

For those Parish & Town Councils that request it, the Council will continue to post physical copies of applications on a weekly basis (this will be sent in addition to the email notification). However, to avoid unnecessary wastage, and postage and printing costs, CDC would like Parish Council to give serious consideration as to whether it actually uses the physical plans that are sent to it. More than half of the applications that the District Council receives are now made electronically without a physical copy of plans and supporting information. Therefore a copy is printed by Craven District specifically to provide to Parish/Town Councils.

In summary, the change would mean that the Parish Council would receive the notifications of applications more promptly.

It was **resolved** that the Parish Council would like to continue to receive a physical copy of relevant planning applications.

## **4. Street Lighting – Wighill Street**

A resident has requested that the bulb on the streetlight on the public footpath on Wighill Street be changed to a lower wattage bulb. The resident has been informed that the bright light maybe the reason that bats which used to roost in her roof have disappeared and also the light blots out the night sky and makes it difficult to see the stars. The resident states that the light is the only light using a bulb this bright along the footpath and since it was installed it has disturbed her sleep and she has been burgled. The resident suggested that a shield could be fitted. The resident lives immediately to the left as you view the column (pictures circulated).

North Yorkshire County Council have confirmed that the new lantern was installed October/November 2010. It is a 50W SON lamp, a lower wattage SON lamp cannot be installed and it is the lowest SON lamp available. No guard/shield can be fitted to this lantern that would reduce the light sideways. NYCC are now using LED lanterns, the lowest being a 10W version.

Other solutions (other than total column removal) are

1, reduce the height of the column by 1 metre, this should have a small impact on the light beam that can be seen from property no. 17

2, replace the lantern with an LED version, there is no guarantee that this would appease the resident.

Please note. The old concrete column that was on site had an 80W MBFU (mercury) lamp housed in a vertical lantern that produced light sideways (photo circulated). This would have been more visible.

The clerk enquired if the light could be switched off at a certain time like the energy reduction programme.

NYCC confirmed they could install a part night PEC that NYCC use as part of their energy reduction programme. It would switch the lamp off at mid-night and back on at 5am. The part night electronic timer is fixed at 00:01 to 5:00. A 10W LED is less bright than a 50W SON lamp, but as LED is white light and SON appears as a golden colour, to a resident the LED "white" light may appear to be brighter than a "golden" light.

With parts for many current lamps becoming obsolete due to EU legislation banning the future use of high Pressure Mercury Vapour (MBF/U) lamps, parish lights will eventually all be changed to LED's.

It was **resolved** that a LED lantern, the lowest a 10W version be fitted with a timer which would switch the light off at mid-night and back on at 5am.

## **5. Collection Point Policy**

Craven District Council will be rolling the collection point policy out to affected households in Sutton in mid to late November.

Paul Florentine, Waste and Recycling Manager will be attending November's meeting to explain the changes.

## 6. Flood Report

### a) Holme Beck

A meeting was held with Claire Brown MCIWEM C.WEM CEnv, FCRM Advisor (Partnership and Strategic Overview Team), North and East Yorkshire from the Environment Agency.

Cllr. Morrell and the clerk attended. The risk of flooding and its prevention was discussed. We are now awaiting a report from Claire on what resources are available for measures to be put in place to help prevent occurrences.

### Aire Valley Sewer

Following a report that the Aire Valley Sewer has been overflowing and contaminating property with raw sewage once again, and that it has been worse this summer than ever before.

A letter was forwarded to Yorkshire Water informing of the above and stating that:

‘Over the last five years Yorkshire Water hosted meetings which members of the local Parish Councils attended. At those meetings Councillors were given assurances that things were being improved. It seems that nothing has improved and the Aire Valley Sewer continues to be operating “beyond capacity” and clearly this sewer cannot sustain any new development.’

### Response from Yorkshire Water:

Where we are today.

The Drainage Area Plan (DAP) known as the Keighley Low Level is now complete and we have put forward proposals for a feasibility study to be done which will look into dealing with 'growth' issues across the catchment.

The study is currently going through our Business Risk Model and once approved, we will be in a better position to identify solutions to any hydraulic issues with the sewer and promote a long term solution.

What we know

The previous issues have been concentrated on the length of concrete sewer which runs from Cross Hills to Keighley and to our knowledge there have only ever been area flooding incidents connected to this.

The DAP should be able to tell us if any flooding experienced away from this area is connected to this particular length of pipe, but until the recent incidents have been fully investigated it would be premature to assume that the flooding was due to overloading.

Please be assured that we are doing a lot of work to help us come up with a solution to the flooding incidents around Eastburn and Steeton. We appreciate the residents' continued patience and help in reporting any further incidents to us.

Yorkshire Water will be in touch again on the 23<sup>rd</sup> October.

## 7. Footpath Report

### Gatering Lane / Wet Ings Lane

Complaints have been received about the amount of dog fouling on Gatering/Wet Ings Lane.

The matter has been reported to the Dog Warden.

The collapsing wall on Wet Ings Lane and stones disappearing is causing problems for footpath users. The path is a designated route to school.

It was **resolved** that the clerk contact North Yorkshire County Council Public Rights of Way and arrange a meeting.

## 8. Councillor Training

Details of training events were circulated to members.
