

Here's how the service will operate:

- 1) You are asked to observe physical distancing (2 metres). There will be notices reminding you of this at regular intervals, both inside and outside the church.
- 2) The service will be less than 1 hour in length
- 3) You will not be offered a service booklet but will find one in your pew. You should take this booklet home with you and bring it back to church each Sunday you attend.
- 4) On entering the church you will be required to sanitise your hands (sanitiser provided)
- 5) On entry, welcomers will ask and make a note of your name (for track and trace purposes). The list of names will be kept for 21 days and then destroyed.
- 6) Numbers of people attending will be regulated so that social distancing can be observed at all times. In the unlikely situation of maximum numbers being reached, welcomers will explain to anyone else trying to attend, that it is not possible to admit them.
- 7) You will be invited to sit where the pew has been marked for seating. If you attend with your 'bubble' you can all sit together. Welcomers will explain this on arrival.
- 8) Masks will not be offered. If you would like to wear a mask you will need to provide your own.
- 9) Communion:
 - * only the bread will be offered. This will be offered without hand contact and without words being spoken as those who administer will not be wearing masks
 - * you will receive the bread in standing position ie no kneeling at altar rail
 - * There will be 2 places in the church for receiving the bread
 - * Ushers will direct you to the appropriate point to receive communion and you should not get leave your pew until invited to do so.
 - * Ushers will offer you hand sanitiser just before you receive the bread.
- 10) Sharing the Peace: you will be invited to share in the peace whilst remaining in your pew.
- 11) Collection: There will be a basket to receive financial offerings as you leave the church. There will also be a card set at £10 for those wishing to use their credit/debit card.
- 12) Music during the service will be offered by the Director of Music and a Cantor/s. Worshippers are discouraged from singing.
- 13) There will not be any refreshments after the service
- 14) Toilets: until the new Centre is completed, these will continue to be the temporary toilets in the carpark. (Should these be removed, toilets will be available in the Old Church)
- 15) There will be a maximum of 3 parking spaces available in the rectory grounds.
