DIGGING INTO THE PAST

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

A Parochial Church Council Meeting was held on Thursday, April 12th 1934 immediately after the Vestry meeting and the same members present..

Minutes - The minutes of the last Council were read and adopted.

Ruridecanal Representative - Proposed Mr Statham and seconded Mr Whittaker that Mrs Goodwin again be representative for Bramshall. Everyone hoped Mrs Goodwin would be restored to her normal health by that time.

Council - It was agreed that the Church Council for the ensuing year to reelected en bloc with the addition of Mr Colin Bayley, The Park, this was proposed by Mr Whittaker and Mr J C DeVille being seconder and carried.

Quota - Proposed by Mr Statham and seconded by Mr Bentley that the Quota of Obligation be paid – carried.

Lord Robert Memorial Fund - An appeal for the Lord Robert Memorial fund by Mr DeVille and it was agreed that two pounds be given from the Church funds.

Sidesmen - Proposed by Mr Whittaker Jnr and seconded by Mr Searle that the Sidesmen be re-elected en bloc – carried.

Secretary - Mr DeVille proposed and was carried that Mr Lindop be Secretary and Treasurer for the Church Council for the ensuing year.

Auditor - Proposed Mr Searle and seconded by Mr Whittaker Jnr that Mr J C DeVille be Auditor – carried.

Vice Chairman - Proposed Mr Adams and seconded by Mr Bentley Mr Statham be elected – carried.

Sunday School - It was unanimously agreed to hand over from the Church funds five pounds for their summer treat.

Church Lamps - Mr Bentley proposed that the hanging lamps in the Chancel be moved nearer the pulpit and the others in proportion. It was agreed to have this done when re-decorating the Church.

Harvest Festival - Mr Statham resolved that the collections at the Harvest Festival be equally divided between Derby Royal Infirmary, North Staffs and Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institution – all were in favour.

Church Decoration - Estimates were put before the Council for decorating the Church from the following:

Ward & Godbehere £26.5.0, E A Leadbetter £40.6.6. J Beetham £40.15.0, J Phillips & Sons £38.7.6

J. Bloestley £39.10.0

All had the same specifications and after a discussion Mr Whittaker proposed and Mr DeVille seconded that Messrs Ward & Godbehere estimate of £26.5.0 be accepted. Carried. W E Charlton 3/5/35

UKRAINE COLLECTION

Thursday 10th March the Parish Hall became a collection point for items going out to Poland. Our village became grid locked with cars, and people queueing into Church Croft as they patiently waited to leave their contributions. We were so overwhelmed at the response, indicating how far our plea for items had reached, that there was a constant flow of bags filled with really items coming through the doors. And the desire for people to help sort and pack the items was most amazing.



Despite some slight confusion at the start of proceedings as to what items would be acceptable by the organisation to which these were going; everything found an outlet. Nothing was wasted. Ensuring that all the boxes were secure and correctly labelled (in both English and Polish) saw the volunteers working until late on Thursday night, then returning early Friday morning. By lunchtime, Horsley's of Stafford arrived with their largest removal truck which was totally filled with the boxes. I'm sure that everyone involved will have experienced something of that outpouring of love for the Ukrainian refugees, as well as an understanding as to what community truly can be about. Penny's Recipe of the Month

Griddled peaches and mint feta cheese salad.

1 tsp of olive oil,

4 ripe peaches/nectarines stoned and cut into wedges. grated zest and juice of 1 lime 200g bag of mixed salad leaves 1 small red onion thinly sliced, 5oz sugar-snap peas halved lengthways, 2tbls chopped fresh mint, 200g (7oz) feta cheese roughly crumbled. Fresh ground black pepper.



Brush griddle pan, or frying pan with half of the olive oil and heat until slightly smoking.

Toss the peaches/nectarine in the lime juice and place flesh side down onto griddle pan and cook for 2-3mins until charred.

In a large bowl toss together any remaining oil and lime juice add the lime zest, salad leaves, onion, sugar snap peas and mint.

Divide between four bowls or serving plates.

Scatter over the peaches/nectarines and the feta cheese.

Season with freshly grated black pepper and serve warm. Enjoy.

Lovely dish to enjoy when the weather gets a little warmer sitting outside with a nice glass of something!



FAMILY CHOCOLATE BINGO


Friday 8th April at 6pm in the Parish Hall there will be a Family **Chocolate Bingo**, hosted by Rev. John and SallyAnne.

Electoral Roll

Notice is hereby given that the St Lawrence Church Electoral Roll is to be open for review between 1st April and 30th April 2022. Under the Church Representation Rules persons are entitled to have their names entered on the roll if they:

Are baptized and will be 16yrs of age during the year of 2017 (those aged under 16 may not vote before their 16th birthday). Have signed a form of application for enrolment, and either

Are members of the Church of England or of any Church in communion with the Church of England being resident in the parish, or (not being resident in the parish) having habitually attended public worship in the parish during the six months prior to the application for enrolment;

or

Are members in good standing of a Church (not in communion with the Church of England) which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity declaring themselves to be also members of the Church of England and having habitually attended public worship during the six month period prior to enrolment.

Forms of application for enrolment can be obtained from the undersigned. In order to be entitled to attend the annual parochial church meeting, and to take part in its proceedings, forms of application for enrolment must be returned by the 30th April 2022, if you are not already on the electoral roll. The new Electoral Roll will be available for inspection in church from Sunday 8th May 2022. Any error discovered in the roll should be reported at once to the PCC Secretary/Electoral Roll Officer.
