For several years the Parochial Church Council has been working towards the next (and most significant) phase in ongoing improvements to the access requirements for public buildings; that of providing toilet and hospitality facilities. The Church has just received permission to build an extension for a disabled toilet and small kitchenette and also to upgrade the heating system within the church. The project will involve the demolition of the two existing brick lean-to structures, and using the 'footprint' of the smaller to construct a single floor extension in matching 'Hollington' stone. The total project cost is expected to be £75,000.

We are a small Parish with only 55 on the Parish electoral roll and an average congregation of 20 each Sunday. Over the past couple of years we

have managed to meet our financial commitments through planned giving and fund-raising events; for which we would like to express our thanks to all who support the church in whatever way. However, this project sets another financial challenge.

The PCC of St. Lawrence does have a reserve fund, but the shortfall for financing this project is £25,000. We are making our case to local and national trusts which can make grants towards this type of improvement. The members of the Church will continue to fund raise in their traditional way. But it is obvious that the church in Bramshall is going to need all the help it can get. It is our hope and belief that those who live in the Parish, or have a close contact with it, will be prepared to make a contribution towards the cost of the work. It is our hope that even those who are not worshippers will recognise the importance of the Church, as a building, to the needs and ambience of the village.

The photography was stunning and the excellent presentation introduced some lovely places to visit which are not far away.

Continuing Andrew Dartnell's article of his recent trip to China.

Beijing, with its population of some 22 million, has, since 1949, been the capital of China. It is world-famous both historically and culturally having a gathering of Chinese arts and customs from every dynasty. It is a city with numerous places to see and visit, among them the Forbidden City (the former Royal Palace from the Ming Dynasty), the Summer Palace and the largest city centre square in the world – Tiananmen Square. The Great Wall of China is close by the city.

The Forbidden City



Travelling in and around Beijing is extremely easy; the city is well provided with a modern subway and bus network which uses a fare system very similar to the 'Oyster' card in London. Alternatively there are ample supplies of taxis. There is an 'Airport Express' train directly to the city. The Chinese people are extremely friendly and always ready to help, even with obvious language differences.

Our visit this time was full of interest despite the problem of smog. Beijing, like many other Chinese cities, suffers from very poor air quality, particularly at this time of year, when on many days the atmosphere requires wearing of face-masks as protection. Notwithstanding we did have blue sky and sunshine occasionally during our stay.

On one day we rode on a Chinese express train, very similar to the Japanese 'bullet' trains, from Beijing to Tianjin and return. This reached a top speed of 286 kmph (about 180 mph) - truly impressive indeed.



Too soon our stay in Beijing came to an end. There were tears at the airport as we said our goodbyes and joined the flight that left at 01.45 (Chinese time). After more than 10 hours crossing three continents we landed back in Manchester at 04.30 in the morning, some 45 minutes early! Clearing customs, passports etc. we were able to take the first train to Crewe and Uttoxeter where daughter Nicola met us at the station to travel home.

Recipe - Cream cheese and chorizo chicken.

I saw this in a magazine and thought I would give it a try. I always say recipes are only a guide and I would tweak this recipe slightly** but the choice is yours.

2 heaped tablespoons of diced cooked chorizo (can be bought from Tesco and Waitrose chopped into lardoons)

170g carton of Philadelphia garlic and herb cheese

4 skinless chicken breasts

4 small ripe tomatoes, sliced

Olive oil for drizzling

Fresh thyme leaves (optional)

Salt & pepper

Preheat oven to 200-220C (gas mark 7). Mix chorizo into

the cream cheese. **Here I dice a clove of garlic and add to the cream cheese. Season with salt &

pepper. Cut a slit into the chicken breasts and using the knife to open out into a pocket. Stuff each breast with a generous tablespoon of the cheese mixture and press down slightly. Lay each breast on a sheet of greaseproof paper and place on a baking tray. Arrange the sliced tomatoes on top of the chicken breasts, scatter over the thyme leaves (if using), then drizzle with olive oil .Bake in the oven for 20 minutes or until the chicken is cooked through. Serve with green beans or, as I did, with green salad. Hope you enjoy. *Penny Gilpin*
