

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Witness Appeals:- there have been two incidents in Bramshall in the past month.

Between **11.20hrs on Tuesday 22nd and 12.45hrs on Friday 25/3/2016** a burglary occurred at a property on Leigh Lane where damage was caused to gain entry and also a large amount of property was stolen, mostly jewellery. Bramshall & District Gardening Club

'Natural Wonders of New Zealand' was the subject of the last Gardening Club meeting and Clive Tuck presented an evening of slides and videos showing many such wonders. For instance, one could experience the thrill of leaving Auckland in a small boat and almost immediately finding dolphins in huge numbers (around two thousand) swimming all around, accompanied by a myriad of gannets diving for fish. Or there are the superb geysers and hot springs at Rotorua, where you have to tread carefully to avoid the steam which issues from the ground all around.

Both the North Island and South Island have areas where the original tropical forest still remains and much conservation work is being done to retain the vulnerable indigenous wildlife. Slides of many of these were presented, including three types of kiwi, several sorts of penguin, fur seals, albatrosses and many different birds, including Kea, which are green parrots who unfortunately have an appetite for wind-screen-wiper blades!

The scenic beauty was covered by the lakes and mountains of the Southern Alps and the wonders of Milford Sound, an area where waterfalls, mists and rainbows add to the spectacle of the majestic fjords. A very enjoyable and informative evening.

On 19th May, the Club is joining with the Stramshall Gardening Club for an outing to Lea Gardens near Matlock. Otherwise, there are no meetings over the summer - the next one is on Monday 26th September when Ron Rock will present a highly-acclaimed presentation on bees.

A number of complaints have reached us regarding dog mess especially along Stocks Lane. This is very inconsiderate when most parishioners are doing their best to tidy their front gardens and all public places in the village. The only suggestion we can make is to be extra vigilant when out dog walking and if you see someone not picking up their dog's mess then take a photo on your phone. Evidence is what we need – it may not be a resident in the village it could be someone who comes to Bramshall walking their dog so please keep your eyes peeled!!

Following a recent PCC meeting the subject of dog fouling in the churchyard and paths leading to it has got to the stage whereby we have to insist that:

ALL DOGS MUST BE ON A LEAD AT ALL TIMES THROUGH THE CHURCHYARD AND EVERYONE TO KEEP TO THE PATHS UNLESS VISITING A GRAVE. The church grounds are consecrated land and as such should be treated with respect. Please will all dog owners act responsibly and not allow their animals to foul this area.

The clean up at Easter pales into insignificance as far as the BKV competition is concerned if we do not get to grips with dog fouling – please can we see a BIG improvement as the 1st May looms when our judges will be out and about. This year we were hoping for the top prize for small villages we shall see!!




A HUGE thank you to everyone who donated towards Mustachio's Vet bill recently. The final bill came to £530 and between us we raised all that cash.

Recipe for June - Acapulco Chicken

1 tablespoon oil
6 boneless, skinless chicken breasts cut into chunks/cubes
1 onion
2 cloves garlic
1-2 teaspoons chilli powder
1 x 14oz can of chopped tomatoes plus 6 fl. oz chicken stock
1 x 14oz can of red kidney beans
Tortilla crisps, salt & pepper and crème fraiche to garnish

Heat the oil in a pan and add the chicken pieces. Add onion and garlic and fry for 5 minutes. Add chilli powder and stir in, then add tomatoes, chicken stock, red kidney beans and season. You can adjust the amount of chilli powder depending on how hot you like it. Cook and bring to the boil, cover and simmer for 20minutes or until the chicken is tender. Transfer to a dish and sprinkle with tortilla crisps. When serving on a plate I add a spoonful of crème fraiche. Add some tortilla crisps if required. I serve with either boiled rice or a jacket potato.

This is a very tasty and quick recipe. Hope you enjoy.
