At the end of July we joined with Stramshall Gardening Club to visit Grafton Cottage near Barton-under-Needwood where we spent a delightful evening entranced by the dazzling display of colour in the densely packed flower beds. There was no evidence of drought, as a very efficient irrigation system had ensured that everything was in tip-top condition. Over a hundred species of Clematis were present, many of them in flower, and the profusion of lilies made a tremendous impression both on the eyes and nose. The front of the cottage was taken up by beds of pastel-shaded annuals and magnificent Hollyhocks and, at the side, was a vertical display of vivid red Pelargoniums. It was salutary to find out that the garden has received over forty years of care and attention to produce the excellent show which we thoroughly enjoyed experiencing.

Following the summer break, Bramshall Gardening Club will be resuming its regular monthly meetings (last Monday of the month) on **Monday 24th September**. This will be the start of the season 2018-2019, so new membership cards will be available. The cost of membership is £13.00 for the year or £3.00 for attendance at individual meetings.

Joining for the year is doubly worthwhile. This is because, as well as the opportunity to enjoy interesting and useful meetings, Gardening Club members are able to benefit from a generous 10% discount at the Strawberry Garden Centre on purchases above £10 (excluding discounted items) on presentation of their Membership Card.
