

Bramshall & District Gardening Club

Where in England is a public park which has the turf stripped off each year so that it can be stored and re-laid later? Geoff Smith, the speaker at the last Gardening Club meeting gave the answer - it is the 14-acre park next to Chelsea Hospital where the Chelsea Show is held. Each year the park spends two weeks in April looking like a building site with hundreds of tons of earth being moved and two of the biggest tents in the world being erected.

Geoff, who regularly exhibits Fuchsias at the show, took us behind the scenes to give us an idea of the tremendous organisational feat which makes the show possible. For instance, there is no water in the park, so 2½ miles of blue plastic pipe have to be laid and hidden from view. During the presentation, Geoff showed many of the best prizewinning garden designs from the last few years which were all very impressive. Some of them were transported there complete with full size trees from as far away as Abu Dhabi!

At the end of the show, all the plants are sold off and the streets are filled with people struggling with heavy pots, trees and 10 foot delphiniums. Somehow, the London transport system is able to cope. A very entertaining evening.

The next meeting is about making gardening a lot easier with 'No Dig' Cultivation. Mick Poultney will be presenting this useful subject on **Monday 25th April** at 7:45pm in the Bramshall Parish Hall.

Received from Clive Lawton Area Co-ordinator of Operation Christmas Child – Shoeboxes for Children

May we take this opportunity to thank you for your support with the 2015 annual appeal. The total number of boxes which were sent from the Warehouse in Burton totalled **8000** and these were sent to

needy children in Macedonia. Your contribution to this figure is very much appreciated and made a difference to children throughout the world at Christmas.

Operation Christmas Child is a small part of the Samaritan's Purse Organisation which has a worldwide network. Thirteen donor countries last year donated 10.5 million boxes which were delivered to 111 recipient countries throughout the world.

Samaritan's Purse works throughout the year to provide clean water through its arm called "Turn on the Tap" employing geologists and drilling specialists to provide bore-holes to tap subterranean clean water.

Through its emergency fund it provides immediate assistance when major disasters strike such as the Nepalese earthquake. There is also a U.K. arm which last year supported people on the Somerset Levels and also the flooding in Cumbria.

We trust you will be in a position to offer your assistance again with this year's appeal.

RECIPES Oxtail Stew - I always cook this recipe a day before I want to eat it.

When my parents were farming up in North Yorkshire, we used to have a four oven Aga in the kitchen and my mother used to cook lunch for my father, herself plus 3 daughters and the 3 farm hands. A good winter lunch was Oxtail stew which was loved by one and all. The Aga was great for this dish as it needed to be slow cooked. I made an oxtail stew recently for my dear 83 year old friend who was a farmer's daughter in the Dales and had never had the stew: she never fancied it because of the fat!!

Try this recipe and guess what—you don't need an Aga!!

Ingredients

1 fresh oxtail (from your local butcher and have it chopped into lumps)

don't buy a pre-packed one

2 medium onions sliced. 2 medium carrots cut into chunks

3/4 pint of beef stock. 3/4 pint of red wine

Seasoned flour. Salt & freshly milled black pepper

2 tablespoons of oil or beef dripping



Melt the oil in a large frying pan. Coat each piece of oxtail in the seasoned flour and fry to a nutty brown colour and place in a casserole dish. Next, fry the onion & carrot and add to the oxtail. Add the seasoned flour to the pan and slowly add the stock followed by the wine. Keep stirring so that no lumps appear. Season the sauce with pepper and pour into the casserole. Put on a close fitting lid and slow cook in oven at 150C for 3 hours. Take out, let it cool and add a sheet of kitchen paper on top of the stew. This will soak up any fat. The day of eating I put it back into the oven at 150C for another hour or so then serve with mashed potatoes and green vegetables.

By the way, my 83 year old friend loved the recipe and froze the remainder to have at a later date—whoopee!! Bear in mind, we can still have cold days in March/April.

Recipe for <u>Bobotie</u> (a delicious South African dish served by Linda Walmsley at her Lenten lunch which can be served as a simple supper or as a main course)

Ingredients

60g butter or margarine
1 large onion chopped
15ml (1tbspoon) curry powder
2slices white bread, crusts removed
125ml (1/2 cup) milk
500g minced lamb or beef (lean)
125ml (1/2 cup) seedless raisins
45ml (3tbsp) lemon juice
30ml (2tbsp) fruit chutney
5ml (1tsp) salt
Black pepper
1egg
Lemon leaves or bay leaves

Melt the butter, add the onion and sauté until soft. Stir in the curry powder.

Soak bread in the milk. Squeeze out and reserve the milk. Add the bread to the onion together with the mince, raisins, lemon juice, chutney, salt and pepper. Cook for 5 minutes then transfer to a shallow casserole dish.

In a small bowl, beat the reserved milk with the egg and pour over the mince.

Bake at 160C for 30minutes. Remove from the oven and insert a few rolled lemon leaves or bay leaves to garnish.
