BRAMSHALL AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

The subject of the last meeting was 'Dwarf Bulbs' and Dave Mountfort gave an excellent presentation illustrated with superb slides (most of which he took in his garden), on the many different varieties which can give colourful displays in the garden throughout the year.

It was most interesting to hear about autumn flowering bulbs and he had suggestions of *Euconium* which gives vividly coloured spikes of flowers, *Colchicum Bormuelleri*, which give crocus-like flowers and, due to its dwarf stance does not get spoiled by the rain so much as normal Colchicums, and *Sternbergia* which looks like a crocus and flourishes in poor dry soil.

Winter flowering bulbs include *Cyclamen Coum*, which, like other hardy Cyclamens, does particularly well growing underneath deciduous trees and some of the early snowdrops. There are apparently 200-300 species of snowdrop, so with judicial choice of which ones to plant, their flowers can be enjoyed from December to March.

Some unusual bulbs (which tend to be on the expensive side) are Trilliums, with a very pronounced 3-part flower and *Rhodohypoxsis*, whose cascades of flowers fill the months from May to August.

The December meeting will be the Christmas dinner, organised for Monday 10th December and the new year will begin with a presentation by Clive Tuck on the 'The Natural Delights of Nepal'. This will take place at Bramshall Parish Hall on Monday 28th January 2019 at 7:30pm.

Please put this date in your diary and don't forget - Gardening Club members can claim a 10% discount at the Strawberry Garden Centre on purchases above £10 (excluding discounted items) – just present a 2018-19 Membership Card.

RECIPE

Home Made Burgers
11b Minced beef.
1 small onion chopped small pieces.
1 carrot grated,
1 parsnip grated.
1 clove of garlic.
1 tablespoon grated Parmesan cheese.
Salt and pepper.
Pinch of chilli flakes (optional)



Mix all the ingredients in a bowl, if you do not fancy grated carrot and parsnip then leave out, but they do add some texture and taste to the burgers. The grated parmesan actually binds the burgers together when you are shaping them which you do with your hands. Fry burgers in frying pan and you can also add some mild curry powder if you want some spicy taste.

There is so much in the papers now about how bad red meat can be for you. I was a farmers daughter and went to Agricultural College to get a degree in farming which I did. British beef was reared very differently then, most breeds were British reared on natural milk from their mothers and fed on grass. My father used to say what goes in at one end comes out the other and back into the soil which was so good for the land. The quality of soil was very good then, in the soil you would see worms and insects, you go in fields now worms are a rarity - they have been destroyed by modern fertiliser which has chemicals in it and kill good soil. When in a supermarket if I want meat I buy fresh from the meat counter as it is mostly English meat. All meat packed has come from a distribution centre and could be from anywhere. Therefore I buy 95% of meat from the butcher, he knows where his meat has come from and is British. The other week I ordered a large rib of beef which was tender the fat was a nice creamy white in colour which shows it had been fed on grass and is therefore a good natural fat and not saturated, this helps you build up good immune system. Chicken for roasting from butcher is not filled with water to make it look bigger. A supermarket chicken takes 6weeks from being hatched to be on the shelf it has been filled with liquid to make it look bigger. Mince beef has 10% less fat than packed supermarket mince
