The evening of Saturday 25th March sees a return to Bramshall Parish Hall for Kel Elliott, accompanied by Her Three Man Orchestra in "The Truths and Tall Tales Tour". More details next month, but put this date on your calendar.

Kel Elliott is a sassy double-bass playing singer who likes to tell stories: her own and other people's. She spends lots of her time striking up conversations, and whenever she can, records them, turning the bits that inspire her most into songs. Next, she takes these songs and then hammers them out on stage with humour, irony and a touch of mischief. With a love for artists such as Tom Waits, Bonnie Raitt, Regina Spektor and Rufus Wainwright her set can be soft and sentimental one minute and unflinchingly eccentric the next.

Kel is joined on stage by her song writing partner Kelvin Leitch, her husband Hugh Rashleigh and their very good friend Adam Cross. The three guys perform on such a wide, and sometimes unusual, array of instruments that they have earned the tag line 'three man orchestra'. They often play multiple instruments at the same time making them visually alluring too.

Recent achievements include being hand picked by Jo Whiley and Jamie Cullum for The BBC Introducing stage at The Cheltenham Jazz Festival. The show was recorded for air on BBC Radio 2 and hosted by Jo Whiley who said she had really enjoyed their set.

BRAMSHALL AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

Looking around our gardens, it is surprising how many of the familiar plants and flowers are from very different parts of the world – they were first brought here by explorers who often risked their lives to obtain them. Some of their fascinating stories were told by John Hawkins at the last Gardening Club meeting.

Exotic trees and plants were in demand by stately home owners and there was keen competition to get there first. David Douglas was sent on three expeditions to North America in the 18th century and brought back Lupins and Penstemons, George Forrest went to the Far East and brought back remarkable species of Primula and the most prolific explorer, Ernest Wilson, went to China and brought back Tiger Lilies, Magnolia and the remarkable Handkerchief tree (*Davidia involucrate*).

The plants from Australia were largely brought back by Sir Joseph Banks who paid to go with Captain Cook on his exploratory voyage to the Pacific. They anchored along the East Coast in the location of present day Sydney and found so many new specimens that they called the place Botany Bay. It was a very interesting evening – it gave us a new way of looking at the many plants in our gardens!

The next meeting will be on **Monday 30th January** (7:45pm in the Parish Hall) when Ruth Williams will give an intriguing and revealing talk on the Hidden Places of Staffordshire.

Did you know that you are now able to receive real-time crime alerts through Staffordshire Smart Alert?

This new exciting development means that local officers can send instant alerts when a crime has just taken place, or is taking place, in their area. Alerts can be sent out to a radius ranging from 3km down to a single street in an area, for example, where a child has gone missing or a home has been broken into.

This latest update will allow you to play a more active role in your community and act as the eyes and ears of Staffordshire Police to help stop criminals in their tracks.

If you are an App user, all you have to do is click on "Preferences", enter your postcode and make sure the 'GPS' button is switched 'On' You can also personalise your alerts to find out more about rural, horse,

canal, school, cycle and business crime.
