

DIGGING INTO THE PAST

General Church Council Meeting 7pm Feb 16 1925.

The Vicar in the chair – Rev L. Knight-Smith

Mesdames: Gould, Whittaker, Potts, Deakin.

Messrs: Martin, Whittaker, Phillips, Statham, J. Buckley, T. Durose (The Grange),
Adams, Fradley Snr, Fradley Jnr, Bentley, Lindop.

Accounts: were read over by the Secretary for the year showing a balance of £21.19.9.

Elections: The following were then duly elected:

Ruridecanal Representative: Mrs Alice Whittaker.

Parochial Church Council:

Mesdames: Gould, Potts, Loverock, Deakin.

Messrs: Martin, Whittaker, Phillips, Lindop, Statham, J. Buckley,
T. Durose (The Grange), J. Mycock, DeVille, Ellaway Smith,
Adams, T. Fradley Snr, T. Fradley Jnr.

Proposed, seconded carried that an attendance book be procured by the Secretary to be signed by each Councillor present at each meeting.

Parish Tea: A vote of thanks to the ladies who carried out the arrangements so successfully was proposed by Mr Martin, seconded by Mr Statham, carried unanimously. Mrs Gould handed in a balance of £1.13.10 which was considered very satisfactory. Mr Lindop proposed this amount should be kept for the purpose of going towards a choir outing, was seconded by Mr Whittaker and carried. The balance of £1.13.10 was then handed over to the Secretary to be earmarked for that purpose.

Fencing Estimates: It was proposed by Mr Whittaker that Messrs Lyons estimate be accepted for a timber fence at £24.10/- seconded by Mr Statham. Mr Buckley then proposed an amendment that an iron fence would be better. The Chairman took a ballot of all present where Mr Whittaker's proposal gained a big majority. It was therefore carried and that Mr J. Fradley Jnr would fix the fencing. It was also resolved that Mr Martin would stake out the ground with Mr Fradley to get the exact measurements.

This concluded the meeting.

L. Knight-Smith Feb 19 1926

Vestry meeting in the Parish hall at 7.30pm April 17 1925.

The Vicar in the chair. The meeting was opened with prayer. The minutes of the last meeting were read and signed.

Election of Vicar's Warden and People's Warden:

The Vicar expressed his gratitude to the Churchwardens for their loyalty and zeal, and also to the members of the congregation for the Easter offering that had been made to him. He then recommended Mr George Martin as his Warden for the ensuing year and Mr Martin consented to accept. On the proposition of Mr JC DeVille, seconded by Mr J. Buckley Mr R. Whittaker was unanimously re-elected as People's Warden. Mr Whittaker and Mr Martin suitably replied.

Additions to Churchyard:

With regard to the new fence round the additional churchyard, it was decided that light posts should be placed midway between the main posts. It was agreed that the fence at the east end of the church should be laid. It was also decided on the motion of Mr Statham, seconded by Mr Bentley that the old hedge on the north side of the church should be stocked.

Consecration of land - The Vicar then reported as to the legal requirements that would have to be complied with before consecration and undertook to communicate further with the Diocesan Registrar on the matter.

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING – held on September 8th 1925

Very brief notes made.....

Quota: Propose and seconded that the Secretary pay the half yearly quota of £5.16.10 to the Diocesan organisation.

Ladder: It was agreed that the procedure adopted by the Secretary in paying Mr Whieldon 30/- to replace broken ladder and we keep old ladder.

Addition to Churchyard: The draft of the conveyance was exhibited to the Council which was found in order and it was agreed same should be completed.

Fencing:

Proposed and seconded that extra posts be put to strengthen same size 4" x 4" with bottoms no. 30.

Bell Hammer: Proposed that Bell Hammer be repaired and that Mr Adams attend to same.

Windows: Proposed that the windows in church be repaired temporarily.

Co-opt: Proposed that Mr Boone be co-opted on the Church Council.

Harvest Festival: Proposed that it should be held on Friday 25th Sept and Sunday 27th Sept, collections to go to Hartshill Infirmary.

Penny's Recipe of the Month

Beefburgers with Blue Cheese Sauce



Ingredients:

9oz lean minced beef
4 small gherkins finely chopped
3tbsl fresh chopped parsley
1 egg yolk
1tblsp sunflower oil
1tblsp Dijon mustard
2tblsp mayonnaise
2oz blue cheese such as Stilton or Gorgonzola crumbled
Salt and pepper.
Seeded burger buns, shredded lettuce, and sliced tomato to serve.

Mix together the mince, gherkins, parsley, egg yolk and plenty of salt and pepper. Shape the mixture into even sized burgers. brush the burgers with a little oil and cook in a hot frying pan for 3-4minutes on each side until well browned but still slightly pink in the centre. Meanwhile stir the mustard and mayonnaise together and then fold in the blue cheese. Serve the burger in seeded buns with plenty of salad and a good dollop of the blue cheese dressing. Enjoy.
