**D** & G Bus, who operate the route 841 between Uttoxeter and Stafford have published a new timetable for their buses that not only changes the departure times but also no longer serves Great Haywood and Tixall because the buses now take a different route.

From Monday 29 April departures from Bramshall to Stafford leave at:-07.41, 09.31, 10.31, 11.31, 12.31, 13.31, 14.31, 15.31, 16.41.and 17.31.

In the opposite direction buses leave Bramshall for Uttoxeter at:-08.12, 09.42, 10.32, 11.42, 12.42, 13.42, 14.42, 16.32, 17.32 and 18.42.

As mentioned above the bus route for the 841 has also been changed; after Hixon Bank House the bus makes its way along New Road to join the A51 road (northbound). At Weston Cross Roads, all buses turn left and climb Weston Bank, as far as Weston Hall where three services turn right and travel through Salt and Hopton to rejoin the A518 at the Staffordshire Showground before continuing towards Stafford. Other services travel along the A518, past the Showground en route to Stafford.

#### Pasta and Sun-dried Tomato for 4 people.

Ingredients:-1½oz Butter 2 Cloves Garlic 3oz Parma Ham 1oz Chopped Basil 11b Pasta Jar of Sun Dried Tomato



Drain the tomatoes and soak for 20 mins in warm water and then add the chopped basil. In a pan melt the butter over a moderate heat then add crushed garlic and the Parma ham which has been torn into small strips. Cook for 5 mins then add the soaked sun dried tomato. Cook the pasta in boiling water for approx. 10mins or until soft. When the pasta is cooked drain and add to your mix of ham and tomato. Stir together then serve onto plates with some grated parmesan cheese. You can use any pasta you choose although I lean more towards Penne or similar.

#### Burglaries

In the early hours of Monday 6<sup>th</sup> May Crag Mount was accessed through a hedge by 4 men. They tried vehicles and gained access to 2 vans one of which was taken (the other had tools taken from it). The van was recovered only a short while after still on Leigh Lane (after the Pigeonhay Lane turning) it had crashed and was on its side.

The police were notified immediately and have gone through CCTV footage thoroughly, they believe that they were part of an organised group targeting vans but feel that we should all be vigilant.

Whilst this experience has left Lloyd & Linzi feeling unnerved (mainly due to the brazen nature of the criminals) they feel lucky that their house hadn't been tried. In the 17 years that they have lived in Bramshall this is the first time they've fallen foul to any form of theft and feel wholeheartedly that the police have handled the crime with great care and attention.

Unfortunately this was not an isolated incident; a house on Stone Road was burgled around 11.00 am on Wednesday 8th May. We all need to be alert, helping to keep our own and our neighbours' property safe.



#### BRAMSHALL AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

For the April meeting, we were pleased to welcome Robert Barlow who spoke about Hostas and he also brought along a good selection of these plants, including two new varieties which he has recently developed. Apparently, Hostas first came to Europe from East Asia in the  $16^{\text{th}}$  century and, since that time, many different varieties have been produced – today there are over 16,000 types to choose from!

Due to the fact that there are early and late varieties, Hostas can be made to give a good display for 8 months of the year and they come in a range of sizes and leaf colours (light green, medium green, dark green, bluish green and deep blue green) so they can add a good deal of interest to a garden. The blue leaf colour is produced by the existence of a fine white powder on the leaf and a heavy downpour of rain can wash this off and cause the leaf colour to revert to green. The flowers tend to be pale pink or lavender coloured, although a new yellow-flowered variety has just been developed. It was good to see the range of features offered by Hostas in the plants which Robert brought to the meeting and we were pleased to be able to purchase some of them.

This was the last meeting of the current season. There is a break over the summer, and the new season will begin on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> September, when we will be pleased to welcome popular BBC West Midlands gardening expert Darren Rudge. He will be speaking about tried and tested ways of getting the best out of your garden plants. Please put the date in your diary.
