DIGGING INTO THE PAST

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

The Annual Vestry meeting was held on April 27th 1933 8 pm.

Present: Rev W E Charlton B.A. presiding.

Mesdames: Searle, Goodwin

Messrs: J Bentley, R. Whittaker Jnr (Wardens) J Adams T, Durose,
J C DeVille, J H Lindop, H. Statham, and H.Potter.

Minutes: The minutes of the last Annual meeting were read and adopted.

J C DeVille on behalf of the Parishioners thanked the Vicar for this kindness in again giving his Easter offering to the needy of Bramshall £3.8.4. The Vicar cordially thanked the Church Wardens, Sidesmen and all other Church workers for their efficient duties during the year. He then informed the meeting that the Parishioners now appointed both Church Wardens but he had the power to settle any dispute that might arise.

Church Wardens: Mr J C DeVille moved and Mr Statham seconded that Messrs J. Bentley and R. Whittaker Jnr be reappointed Wardens for the ensuing year to which all agreed. Both Wardens accepted the office with thanks. This concluded the business of this Vestry meeting.

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

The Annual Parochial Church Council meeting was held on April 27th 1933 immediately after the Vestry meeting and the same people present.

Minutes: The minutes of the last Annual meeting were read and adopted.

The Vicar expressed his sorrow at the passing of Mrs Loverock whom he said was a faithful member of her Church and Council. The members showed their sympathy by standing in silence for a few moments.

Ruridecanal representative: Mrs Goodwin was duly appointed representative to the Ruridecanal conference.

Church Council: Mr DeVille moved and Mr Whittaker seconded that the Church Council for the ensuing year be re-elected en bloc with the additions of Mrs Talbot, proposed by Mrs Goodwin and seconded by Mr Bentley and Mr & Mrs Hugh Sneyd-Kinnersley proposed by Mr Statham and seconded by Mr J. Durose – carried.

Accounts: The accounts for the past year were presented showing a balance in hand of £18.0.1. moved Mr Statham and seconded by Mr Durose that the accounts be adopted.

Insurance: The Vicar thought the Insurance policy should be carefully examined to see if the various items were fully or otherwise insured and if necessary to adjust same without altering the grand total. The meeting agreed that the Vicar and Secretary should attend to it.

Quota: Moved by Mr Statham, seconded by Mr Bentley that the Quota of obligation be paid – carried.

Sidesmen: Proposed by Mr Bentley and seconded Mr J C DeVille that the sidesmen be elected en bloc – carried unanimously. Messrs G. Martin, J C DeVille, F. Searle, H. Statham, R. Whittaker, E. Whittaker, W. Walster, J H Lindop.

Secretary: It was unanimously agreed that Mr Lindop be Secretary for the Parochial Church Council proposed by Mr DeVille and seconded Mr Searle – and carried.

Treasurer (Auditor): Mr Statham moved and seconded by Mr Durose and carried that Mr J.C. DeVille be auditor.

Lord Roberts Appeal: An appeal for Lord Roberts Memorial fund by Mr DeVille had the sympathy of the meeting and agreed that £3 be given from the Church funds.

Estimates – Tarmac: The Secretary was instructed to write for estimates to tarmac the entrance to the Church and also walks from Messrs Ward & Godbehere, Chell and Marsden & Wilcox.


Warners Charity: After a lengthy discussion it was proposed by Mr Bentley and seconded by Mr Whittaker that Warners Charity 10/- be paid into Fradgley Charity – carried unanimously.

Sunday School : It was voted that five pounds be given from the Church funds for the Sunday School summer outing.

The Vicar expressed his appreciation and was sure the Parish at large were grateful to Mrs Lindop for the useful work she was doing in Bramshall – this was supported by all present.

There being no other business the meeting closed with prayer.

February Coffee Morning



Penny's Recipe of the Month

Chicken chilli burgers

Ingredients

1lb lean minced chicken,
2 cloves garlic.
1 red chilli seeded and finely chopped,
1tbsp. of fresh mint finely chopped,
2 tbsp fresh chopped parsley or fresh coriander.
2tsp Worcester sauce,
Olive oil for brushing,
Salt, and ground pepper.



Mix together the minced chicken, garlic, chilli, herbs, Worcester sauce and salt and pepper. Shape the mixture into 4 even sized burgers then brush lightly with the oil. You can grill this on the grill or if the weather is good cook on the barbecue until well browned and cooked through. Serve in fresh baps with some rocket leaves and sliced tomatoes. Enjoy!!
