

PUBLIC MEETING

Sunday 25 March 2017 at 2 pm

Jordanhill Parish Church

As most residents will be aware, the Court of Session ruled against Jordanhill Community Council in its Judicial Review Petition against Glasgow City Council and Interested Parties.

This desperately disappointing news marks the end of our campaign to stop the over-development of Jordanhill Campus.

However, it also marks the start of a new phase in which it is hoped the community will continue to demonstrate the spirit of togetherness which has been evident throughout the last fourteen months since the formation of the Campus Sub-Committee.

A PUBLIC MEETING will therefore be held on Sunday 25 March, starting at 2 pm, with two main objectives:

- 1) To review the Campus Campaign in the light of Lady Wolffe's decision to rule against us;
- 2) To discuss the way forward for the community of Jordanhill, both in terms of minimising the loss of trees, wildlife and special habitats as well as minimising the disruption to residents during the lengthy construction period AND to discuss the formation of a new Jordanhill Community Trust through which we can exert pressure on the City Council to remain true to its pre-election promise to provide a new community facility in all areas of the city.

Your attendance at the PUBLIC MEETING is strongly encouraged so that you can have your say in shaping the future of YOUR community. We are not to get the development most of us thought was appropriate to the special setting of the Campus but we can still make a difference to the long-term future to the wider community of Jordanhill.

Question-and-Answer sessions will follow both main parts of the meeting so please come along and help influence the future of Jordanhill.
