

Supporting TB treatment & control @ St Francis' Hospital, Katete, Zambia



Project Update Report

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Background

Zambia remains in the list of 30 countries in the world with high TB and TB-HIV burden. A national TB strategic plan exists based on the Global Stop TB Strategy. There is a focus on scaling up intensified TB case finding, TB-HIV collaborative services, and building the structure for implementing Programmatic Management of Drug-Resistant Tuberculosis. A national Tuberculosis Prevalence Survey has revealed the country has a higher and unevenly distributed TB burden than previously estimated with a prevalence of 455 cases per 100,000 populations for all ages and all forms of TB. A major collaborative effort is needed if the goal is to be reached of ending the TB epidemic by 2035. The Zambian National Health Strategic Plan identifies a number of key challenges for the TB programmeⁱ. Weak monitoring/evaluation and data management is highlighted but interestingly amongst other areas includes limited involvement of private hospitals in TB programmes and inadequate strategies to address lost-to-follow TB cases. The Logie Legacy has supported the work of the TB programme at St Francis Hospital since 2012. Soon after this date 36 bikes were purchased to assist the volunteers in their efforts to visit more patients, contacts and communities. This update should be read in conjunction with the 2021 TB project evaluation reportⁱⁱ. It identified future steps needed as follows:

1. Seek funding (£2000) for a 3rd bike maintenance workshop (Summer 2021)
2. Explore how to support the patients in more remote locations and distant locations from the hospital ie Motorbike, trailers for bike to bring in sick patients to hospital. Not every TB patient was connected to a treatment supporter. In a larger study involving several TB treatment centres (including St Francis Hospital) 43% of TB patients were connected to a treatment supporterⁱⁱⁱ. The main support received under DOTS included: Adherence support, collection of drugs, spiritual (through home visitations), and general health talks.
3. Revisit the sustainable development assumptions - responsibility for cycle maintenance falls to volunteer and as many have low income they cannot fulfil this obligation.

Progress

- Additional funding during 2021 totalling £2604 was allocated to the project
- A maintenance workshop was held on 13-14th October and 26 bikes were overhauled (see appendix)
- Waterproof wear was provided to enable volunteers to more comfortably visit patients during the rainy season

Awaited

- Report from SFH staff of the impact the project. To cover:
 - Bikes coverage – Geographical and volunteer activity statistics
 - Clothing user satisfaction
- Discussion with hospital management about longer term objectives – see 1&2 above
