Attendance Matters

If your child is unable to attend school, you must phone the school office before 09.30am on the day of the absence. If no message is left in the office, your child's absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

Please be aware that The Education (Pupil Registration) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013 state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. The Headteacher should determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if

In accordance with the above Regulations, requests for leave of absence are treated sympathetically, but only in exceptional circumstances can they be approved. The policy of the Government to which this school has agreed, states that parents who take their child out of school for five days or more during term time, without the authority of the Headteacher, will each be liable to receive a penalty notice. Penalty Notices will be issued by the Local Authority.

The penalty is £60 per parent if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice, rising to £120 per parent if paid after 21 days but within 28 days. If the penalty is not paid in full by the end of the 28-day period the Local Authority must prosecute the recipient for failing to ensure regular school attendance under section 444 Education Act

IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK...

NURSERY

This week in nursery our learning has been based on the song 'Five Little Ducks'. We have made duck masks and acted out the song in small groups. In maths we have been very busy counting and have played lots of number recognition games.

RECEPTION

This week reception have been painting self portraits. In maths, we have been learning about shapes and have created our very own shape pictures. Phonics sessions started this week and we have learnt s a t and p so far. Be sure to have a go at home using the phonics booklets!

YEAR 1

This week in Year 1 we have been researching and learning about our class animals. We looked at non-fiction texts and discussed their features. We produced lots of fantastic facts that our teachers are proud of!:) In maths we have been learning how to subtract by using practical resources and number lines. In PE we have been creating a dance to the story 'The Rainbow Fish.'

YEAR 2

This week Year Two have been continuing to learn about Captain James Cook. After studying the different features of non-fiction books, we have put all of our knowledge together to write some information booklets, including a contents page, sub-headings and illustrations. They look amazing as we were really careful with our handwriting and spelling, and we even tried to use conjunctions to add detail to our sentences. In science we have continued the boat theme by carrying out an experiment to discover how much cargo it takes to sink a boat.

YEAR 3

In Year 3, the children have been researching into different food groups. They have learnt to pick out the key information and then write simple notes to prepare for their writing next week. In maths, the children have solved addition and subtraction calculations using 2 and 3 digit numbers and have used the column method to solve problems.

YEAR 4

In English, we've been busy writing formal letters to Mrs Chadda and Mrs Coleman, persuading them to extend our lunch time break! We have been challenging ourselves in maths, with 4 digit multiplication and subtraction with exchanges. We researched what life was like as a peasant in 1066 and realised it wasn't very nice! In science, we investigated different materials that could be used to soundproof a music box.

YEAR 5

Year 5 have had an action packed week. This week we researched the different places that Henry VIII lived. We pretended to be tour guides and created different trips on google maps to visit these places. We started building our own Tudor houses; we sketched different views of it, and started modelling it with our junk boxes.

YEAR 6

Year 6 have been working hard to become more proficient in multiplication--seriously, ask any one of us what 7893 x 45 is! We have also started working on our WW2 reports, which we know will be encyclopaedia- worthy.
