Hello and welcome back!

I hope that you have had a fantastic Summer holiday with much excitement and adventure. The children have been very enthusiastic in telling me about what they did in their time off and they certainly seem well-rested and ready for the new term. They have settled superbly into their new classes and are off to a great start.

I would like to start with a big thank you to all of the parents that helped with painting in the school over the Summer. Both the main corridor and the hall have been completely revitalised by this and look stunning. We really appreciate your time and effort and it's certainly had a real impact. You may have also noticed our fantastic new nursery equipment, which will be great fun for our very youngest children, as well as being an opportunity for developing gross motor skills. With the new middle garden that was installed at the end of the last term, this is really having a transformative effect on the school, and we certainly aim for this to continue in the coming years.

You may also have noticed that some small tree-like plants have sprouted on the field. These are the roots from previously removed trees spreading and reappearing. Rest assured that these are being safely removed today and treated so that they should not return.

There is a great deal to look forward to this year. We have been delighted to welcome a range of new staff and they have all had a fantastic first week and are incredibly complementary about the school and pupils. We have also taken on board your feedback from last year and a whole range of new initiatives are planned in every area, from using a range of new technology to enhance learning, including iPads and Chromebooks, to ensuring that our whole curriculum is the best it can be for all of our pupils. For our SEND pupils, we are excited to be introducing a range of new proven interventions that will be tailored to meet their additional needs in literacy and maths. Our Inclusion Leader, Jo Coleman, is currently preparing these and we are confident that they will have a huge impact. We also know how important it is that all of our pupils are challenged in their learning, and will be looking to set up further opportunities for excellence groups, as well as making sure that work is effectively differentiated in the classroom.

Our new Sports Specialist, Anna Tambling, is already taking steps to continue the excellent work of Sophie Matthews, and she is certainly planning to continue the new clubs that were so popular last year, including running club, which was definitely a highlight. Details on the club offering for this year will be released shortly. We want to widen our extended provision so that every child has the opportunity to take part in a range of activities during our outside of the school day.
