

You will need:

- 8 FQ's Little Joys
- 1/2m Joy Dottie Multi
- 1/2m Hazel Plaid Binding
- 140cm Square Backing Fabric (I used an extra wide fabric so no join was necessary)
- 135cm Square Wadding

Finished Quilt measures aprox 48" square

Cutting Instructions

From your 8 FQ's	Cut (24) - 3 ½" squares from 2 FQ's
	Cut (25) - 3 ½" squares from 4 FQ's
	Cut (26*) - 3½" squares from 2 FQ's
	(*Reserve 2 squares from each of these
	fabrics for the cornerstones)
Borders	Cut (4) – 42 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles
Binding	Cut (5) - 2 ½" x full width of fabric strip

Piecing Instructions

- 1. Lay out the (196) squares in 14 rows of 14 squares balancing the different fabric designs and fabrics.
- 2. Starting with the top row, stitch the 14 squares together, then press all the seams to the right.



3. Move on to row 2, stitch the 14 squares together, pressing all the seams to the left.




- 4. Move on to row 3, stitch and press to the left, row 4 stitch and press to the right and repeat this for the remaining rows, alternating the direction of the pressed seams. You will have 14 rows, each with 14 squares, each row will measure $42 \% \times 3 \%$
- 5. Next step is to join the rows. Stitch row 1 to row 2, matching up the seams. (The opposite directions that you pressed the seam should help them 'nest' together.)

To help achieve perfectly matching seams, pop some pins in, ensuring that you remove them as you approach when stitching.... DO NOT stitch over them.




Press the seam upwards. This section should measure 42 ½" x 6 ½ x


- 6. Repeat for Rows 3 & 4, then Rows 5 & 6, 7 & 8, 9 & 10, 11 & 12 and finally 13 & 14. Remember to press the seams upwards. You will now have 7 sections.
- 7. Next join these rows together, I do this in various stages, so join 1,2 to 3,4.




Repeat for section 5,6 to 7,8.



And 9,10 to 11,12.




8. To complete, stitch rows 1,2,3,4 to 5,6,7,8




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and 9,10,11,12 to 13,14



Finally stitch these two sections together.

9. To complete the quilt top add the borders to the left and right hand sides. Then stitch the cornerstones to the top and bottom borders, finally stitching these to the quilt top



Finishing

Make a quilt sandwich with quilt top, batting and backing. Machine or hand quilt as desired. Finally add the binding.
