
Staff in our local schools have worked tirelessly to remain open and to keep pupils and staff safe in the classroom under very difficult circumstances. Lady Bay school has had much needed improvements made to the mobile foundation stage classroom, outdoor play area and improvements to the perimeter fencing.

The crucial county council issue this year has been the leading group's administration's push for unitary status for Nottinghamshire, for a second time. This has again been unsuccessful, but local government reform is undoubtedly an issue that will return in some form or other when the more pressing issue of the Coronavirus epidemic has been resolved. Future issues in the Lady Bay area are the POSSIBILITY of house building on Regatta Way, put forward in the Greater Nottingham Strategic Plan and the POSSIBLE new build of Lady Bay Primary school and a new secondary school on county council land in Lady Bay. The county council has commissioned a feasibility study on the schools issue, which is due to be completed shortly and will report back to the county council.
