## Over 40s now eligible for vaccine booster if last jab over six months ago

**You're eligible for your COVID-19 booster if:** 



- You've had a first and second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine over six months (182 days) ago

**AND**

- Aged 40 or over
- A health and social care worker
- An unpaid carer
- Aged 16 or over with a health condition that puts you at greater risk from COVID-19

Our colleagues at the NHS CCG have further outlined where booster and other COVID-19 vaccinations can now be received.

People can [walk in for a booster vaccine](#) at selected sites across the county if they've had a first or second dose of the vaccine over six months or 182 days ago and are aged 40 or over, a health and social care worker, unpaid carer or aged 16 or over with a health condition that puts them at greater risk of COVID-19.

Please continue to take a regular COVID-19 lateral flow test at home or at one of our [Community Testing](#) sites.

Residents and interested parties are invited to have their say on plans for the Ratcliffe on Soar Power Station site and a Local Development Order (LDO) that could give the green light to new industry and business projects and the potential of thousands of permanent highly-skilled jobs.

The power station, owned by international energy company Uniper, will close at the end of September 2024 in line with government policy to end coal-fired power generation.

## Warnings over contact with wild birds in light of avian flu cases



Residents are being urged to ensure they and their pets do not make contact with wild birds after confirmed cases of avian flu in swans in Hickling and nearby Walton on the Wolds in Leicestershire. Nottinghamshire County Council's Trading Standards team is issuing advice and working with us and other partner agencies to reduce the

risk of spreading the avian influenza in line too with a number of cases nationally and advising businesses, schools and residents in possession of poultry and captive birds to keep these birds indoors where possible.

Public health advice remains that the risk to human health from the virus is very low and food standards bodies advise that avian influenzas pose a very low food safety risk for UK consumers. There is no impact on the consumption of properly cooked poultry products including eggs.
