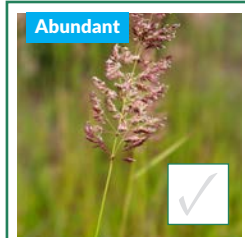


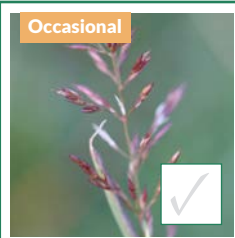


Wern-Y-Cwm Farm

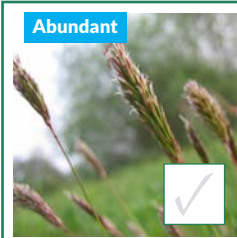

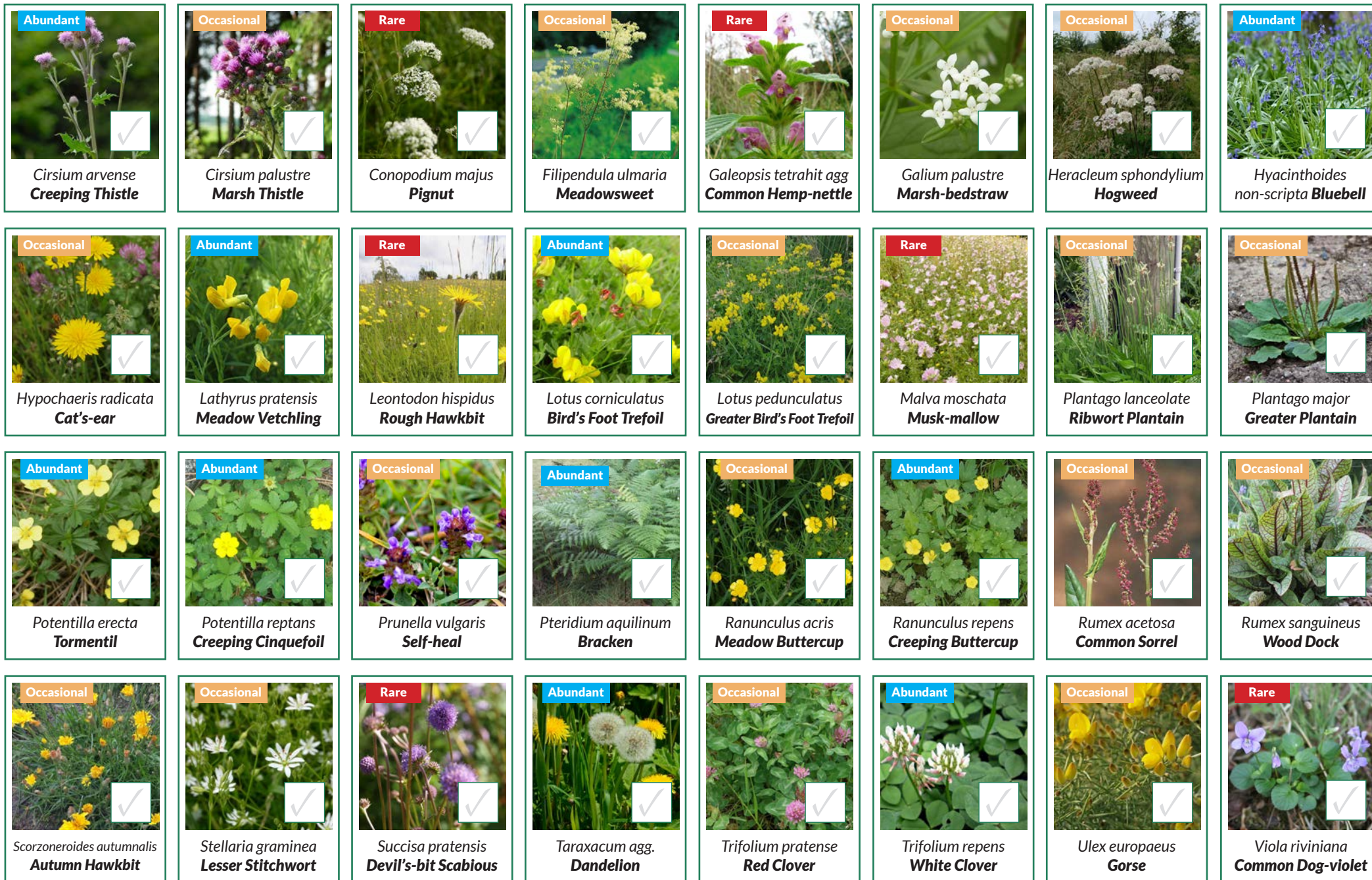
