Rev Penny writes ...

"All I want for Christmas is my two front teeth!" so goes the well-known song written in the 1940's by schoolteacher Donald Gardner. But what do people really want for Christmas? Last year, a popular consumer magazine listed among their top 10 most requested Christmas gifts: a collapsible, re-usable straw, a moon lamp and a back massager. Of course, no Christmas gift



list would be complete without a request for novelty fluffy slippers and matching pyjamas - for all the family! Food plays a major role at Christmas. Is it to be turkey or goose, Christmas pudding or trifle, prosecco or champagne? And the television – there must be films, lots of them: new releases as well as old favourites. And the Queen's speech – when should we listen to Her Majesty's message to us - before or after Christmas lunch?

Just over 2000 years ago a baby was gifted to our world by his Father. This baby was carried by the young girl Mary, who was betrothed to Joseph, a carpenter. As the time for the baby's birth approached, Mary and Joseph found themselves travelling to a strange city, and without anywhere to stay. And so the baby's birth took place in a humble animal barn and was announced to simple peasant shepherds guarding their sheep in the fields around Bethlehem by angels who joyfully sang: "Peace to God's people on Earth."

Later, Wise Men would visit this special baby and Mary his mother bringing presents: gold, frankincense and myrrh. And Mary would thank them and treasure Cont'd.......

these moments, as would any new mother. These were precious first memories of time with her baby. Named by an angel before his birth, he was called Jesus.

Jesus – God's gift to his world, given to help us understand better God and his ways. The baby grew up and as a young man, he taught that we should love God and love those around us, forgiving those who wrong us and extending the hand of friendship to all. And that care should be shown, not just to all people regardless, but to the whole of God's Creation – the whole living world we live in.

So, what do you want for Christmas? What gift would excite you and fill you with joy, what present would bring you satisfaction and contentment?

In John's Gospel, Jesus promises all his followers: "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete" (John 15:9-12)

And later in the same passage he assures us saying: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27) This is the real gift given to us at Christmas — the gift of Jesus — whose birth we remember at this time. Jesus promises to be with us always and to bring us joy and peace and contentment when we trust him to care for us.
